Tips for Staying Warm in Winter

- Open drapes and blinds on sunny days to let sunlight warm your home but close them at night.
- Seal off unused rooms by closing vents and keeping the doors shut tightly.
- Regular check-ups of furnaces will help keep it operating efficiently, saving you money.
- Don't leave space heaters unattended or with children; keep away from combustible materials and only use in well ventilated areas.

Tips for Staying Cool in Summer

- Keep the heat out by drawing shades and drapes and closing blinds on hot days.
- If you have air conditioning, don't cool rooms not being used; close doors & vents in these rooms.
- Don't switch the air conditioner to a colder setting when turning it on. It won't cool any faster.
- Turn the air conditioner thermostat up when you leave the house for several days or longer.
