

1     **BOARD BILL #241**                             **INTRODUCED BY ALDERWOMAN PHYLLIS YOUNG**

2             An Ordinance recommended by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment authorizing  
3     and directing the issuance and delivery of not to exceed \$8,148,000 plus issuance costs principal  
4     amount of tax increment revenue notes (706 Market Redevelopment Project) Series 20\_\_-A/B,  
5     of the City of St. Louis, Missouri; prescribing the form and details of such notes and the  
6     covenants and agreements made by the City to facilitate and protect the payment thereof;  
7     prescribing other matters relating thereto, and containing a severability clause.

8             **WHEREAS**, The City of St. Louis, Missouri (the “City”), is a body corporate and  
9     political subdivision of the State of Missouri, duly created, organized and existing under and by  
10    virtue of its charter, the Constitution and laws of the State of Missouri; and

11            **WHEREAS**, the Real Property Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, Sections  
12    99.800 through 99.865, Revised Statutes of Missouri, (the “TIF Act” or “Act”), authorizes the  
13    City to undertake redevelopment projects within designated areas of the City; and

14            **WHEREAS**, staff and consultants of the City and Market TIF, Inc., a Missouri corporation,  
15    prepared a plan for redevelopment titled “706 Market TIF Redevelopment Plan” dated October  
16    16, 2013, with further amendments, if any, and as may be amended from time to time (the  
17    “Redevelopment Plan”), for an area consisting of the parcel commonly known as 700-706  
18    Market Street (the “Redevelopment Area” or “Area”), which Redevelopment Area is more fully  
19    described in the Redevelopment Plan, such legal description being attached hereto and  
20    incorporated herein as **Exhibit A**; and

21            **WHEREAS**, on October 30, 2013, the TIF Commission found that completion of the  
22    Redevelopment Project (as hereinafter defined) would provide a substantial and significant  
23    public benefit through the elimination of blighting conditions, the strengthening of the

1 employment and economic base of the City, increased property values and tax revenues,  
2 stabilization of the Redevelopment Area, facilitation of the economic stability of the City as a  
3 whole, and further found that without the assistance of tax increment financing in accordance  
4 with the TIF Act, the Redevelopment Project is not financially feasible and would not otherwise  
5 be completed; and

6       **WHEREAS**, on \_\_\_\_\_, 201\_\_, after due consideration of the TIF  
7 Commission’s recommendations and approval by the Board of Aldermen, the Mayor signed: (1)  
8 Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ Board Bill No. \_\_\_\_ designating the Redevelopment Area as a  
9 “redevelopment area” as provided in the TIF Act, approving the Redevelopment Plan, and  
10 approving the redevelopment project described in the Redevelopment Plan (the “Redevelopment  
11 Project”), adopting tax increment allocation financing within the Redevelopment Area, and  
12 establishing the 706 Market Special Allocation Fund; and (2) Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ Board  
13 Bill No. \_\_\_\_ authorizing the City to enter into a redevelopment agreement with Developer (as  
14 hereinafter defined); and

15       **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan and Redevelopment Agreement, the  
16 City proposes to finance a portion of the costs of the Redevelopment Project by utilizing tax  
17 increment allocation financing in accordance with the TIF Act; and

18       **WHEREAS**, the City desires to issue, from time to time, its Tax Increment Revenue  
19 Notes (706 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_-A/B, (the “TIF Notes” or “Notes”), to  
20 provide funds for the aforesaid purpose, said Notes being payable solely from certain proceeds  
21 deposited into the Special Allocation Fund; and



1 respect thereto, adopting tax increment financing within the Redevelopment Area, establishing  
2 the Special Allocation Fund, and authorizing certain related actions by City officials.

3 “Authorized Denominations” means an initial amount of \$100,000 or any integral  
4 multiple of \$1,000 in excess thereof, except with respect to the TIF Note issued upon acceptance  
5 by the City of the final Certificate of Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs, which TIF  
6 Note may be issued in any denomination, subject to the limitation on the aggregate Principal  
7 Amount, subject to the limitation provided in **Section 2.1** of this Ordinance.

8 “Authorizing Ordinance” means Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ Board Bill No. \_\_\_\_\_, signed by  
9 the Mayor on \_\_\_\_\_, 2014, affirming adoption of the Redevelopment Plan,  
10 Redevelopment Area, and Redevelopment Project, authorizing execution of a Redevelopment  
11 Agreement for the construction of the Redevelopment Project and making certain findings  
12 related thereto.

13 “Available Revenues” means all monies on deposit from time to time (including  
14 investment earnings thereon) in (a) the PILOTS Account, and (b) subject to annual  
15 appropriation, the EATS Account that have been appropriated to the repayment of TIF Notes,  
16 excluding (i) any amount paid under protest until the protest is withdrawn or resolved against the  
17 taxpayer or (ii) any sum received by the City which is the subject of a suit or other claim  
18 communicated to the City which suit or claim challenges the collection of such sum.

19 “Bond Counsel” means Armstrong Teasdale LLP, St. Louis, Missouri, and/or an attorney  
20 at law or a firm of attorneys acceptable to the Finance Officer of nationally recognized standing  
21 in matters pertaining to the tax-exempt nature of interest on obligations issued by states and their  
22 political subdivisions duly admitted to the practice of law before the highest court of any state of  
23 the United States of America or the District of Columbia.

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1           “Certificate of Commencement of Construction” means a document substantially in the  
2 form of Exhibit C to the Redevelopment Agreement, delivered by the Developer to the City in  
3 accordance with the Redevelopment Agreement and evidencing commencement of construction  
4 of the Redevelopment Project.

5           “Certificate of Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs” means a document  
6 substantially in the form of Exhibit D to the Redevelopment Agreement provided by the  
7 Developer to the City in accordance with Redevelopment Agreement evidencing Reimbursable  
8 Redevelopment Project Costs incurred by the Developer.

9           “Certificate of Substantial Completion” means a document substantially in the form of  
10 Exhibit E to the Redevelopment Agreement, issued by the Developer to the City in accordance  
11 with the Redevelopment Agreement and evidencing the Developer’s satisfaction of all  
12 obligations and covenants to construct the Redevelopment Project in accordance with the  
13 Redevelopment Plan and the Redevelopment Agreement.

14           “City” means The City of St. Louis, Missouri, a body corporate and political subdivision  
15 duly authorized and existing under its charter and the Constitution and laws of the State of  
16 Missouri.

17           “Debt Service Fund” means the fund by that name created in **Section 4.1** of this  
18 Ordinance.

19           “Debt Service Reserve Fund” means the fund by the name created in **Section 4.1** of this  
20 Ordinance.

21           “Debt Service Reserve Fund Requirement” means that amount as reasonably determined  
22 by the underwriter or placement agent for the TIF Notes with the concurrence of the City’s  
23 Finance Officer.

1           “Developer” means Market TIF, Inc., a Missouri corporation, duly incorporated and  
2 existing under the laws of the State of Missouri, or its permitted successors or assigns in interest.

3           “Disclosure Counsel” means Armstrong Teasdale LLP, St. Louis, Missouri, and/or an  
4 attorney at law or a firm of attorneys acceptable to the Finance Officer of nationally recognized  
5 standing in matters pertaining to offerings of municipal securities duly admitted to the practice of  
6 law before the highest court of any state of the United States of America or the District of  
7 Columbia.

8           “Economic Activity Taxes” or “EATS” shall have the meaning ascribed to such term in  
9 Section 99.805(4) of the TIF Act.

10          “EATS Account” means the EATS Account of the Special Allocation Fund.

11          “Finance Officer” means the Comptroller of the City or her authorized agent.

12          “Issuance Costs” means all costs reasonably incurred by the City or Developer in  
13 furtherance of the issuance of TIF Notes, including without limitation, the fees and expenses of  
14 financial advisors and consultants, the City’s attorneys (including issuer’s counsel, Disclosure  
15 Counsel, Bond Counsel and, at the City’s discretion, Developer’s counsel), the City’s  
16 administrative fees and expenses (including fees and costs of its planning consultants and the St.  
17 Louis Development Corporation), underwriters’ discounts and fees, if any, the costs of printing  
18 any TIF Notes and any official statements relating thereto, the costs of credit enhancement, if  
19 any, capitalized interest, debt service reserves and the fees of any rating agency rating any TIF  
20 Notes.

21          “Issuance Date” means the dated date of the TIF Notes.

22          “Maturity Date” means \_\_\_\_\_, which is the date that is twenty-three (23) years  
23 after the effective date of the Approving Ordinance.

1           “Ordinance” or “Note Ordinance” means this Ordinance as from time to time amended in  
2 accordance with the terms hereof.

3           “Original Purchaser” means the Developer, a Related Entity, a Qualified Institutional  
4 Buyer or a Project Lender; provided, however, that any such Related Entity or Project Lender  
5 shall also qualify as an Approved Investor and shall be designated in writing by the Developer as  
6 the Original Purchaser.

7           “Owner” or “Registered Owner” means, when used with respect to any TIF Note, the  
8 person in whose name such TIF Note is registered.

9           “Payment Date” means, with respect to any TIF Note, each May 1 and November 1,  
10 commencing on the first May 1 or November 1 that immediately succeeds the City’s issuance of  
11 any TIF Obligations.

12           “Payments in Lieu of Taxes” or “PILOTS” shall have the meaning ascribed to such term  
13 in Section 99.805(11) of the TIF Act.

14           “PILOTS Account” means the PILOTS Account of the Special Allocation Fund.

15           “Project Fund” means the fund by that name created in **Section 4.1** of this Ordinance.

16           “Project Lender” means a commercial bank, savings bank, savings and loan association,  
17 credit union or other financial institution that has loaned funds to the Developer to be used for  
18 construction of the Redevelopment Project and has secured such loan with a mortgage or security  
19 interest in the Redevelopment Project.

20           “Qualified Institutional Buyer” means a “qualified institutional buyer” under Rule 144A  
21 promulgated under the Securities Act of 1933.

1           “Redevelopment Agreement” or “Agreement” means that certain Redevelopment  
2 Agreement dated as of \_\_\_\_\_, between the City and the Developer, as may be amended  
3 from time to time.

4           “Redevelopment Area” means the real property legally described and set forth on **Exhibit**  
5 **A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

6           “Redevelopment Plan” means the plan titled “706 Market TIF Redevelopment Plan”  
7 dated October 16, 2013, with further amendments, if any, and as approved by the City pursuant  
8 to the Approving Ordinance, as such plan may from time to time be amended in accordance with  
9 the TIF Act.

10           “Redevelopment Project” or “706 Market Redevelopment Project” means the  
11 redevelopment project as identified by the Redevelopment Plan and Redevelopment Agreement.

12           “Register” or “Note Register” means the books for registration, transfer and exchange of  
13 the TIF Notes kept at the office of the Finance Officer.

14           “Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs” means those Redevelopment Project Costs  
15 for which the Developer is eligible for reimbursement in accordance with the TIF Act and in  
16 accordance with the Redevelopment Agreement.

17           “Related Entity” means any party or entity related to the Developer by one of the  
18 relationships described in Section 267(b), Section 707(b)(1)(A) or Section 707(b)(1)(B) of the  
19 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

20           “Revenue Fund” means the fund by that name created in **Section 4.1** of this Ordinance.

21           “Series A Account” means the account by that name created in **Section 4.1** of this  
22 Ordinance.



1           “Series A Note(s)” means the [Taxable][Tax-Exempt] Tax Increment Revenue Note (706  
2 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_\_-A, issued pursuant to this Ordinance in an  
3 aggregate amount not to exceed \$8,148,000 plus Issuance Costs, in substantially the form set  
4 forth in **Exhibit B**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

5           “Series B Account” means the account by that name created in **Section 4.1** of this  
6 Ordinance.

7           “Series B Note” means the [Taxable][Tax-Exempt] Tax Increment Revenue Note (706  
8 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_\_-B, issued pursuant to the Note Ordinance in an  
9 aggregate amount not to exceed \$8,148,000 plus Issuance Costs, less the aggregate outstanding  
10 principal amount of the Series A Notes, in substantially the form set forth in **Exhibit B**, attached  
11 hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

12           “Special Allocation Fund” means the City of St. Louis, Missouri, 706 Market Special  
13 Allocation Fund created by Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ Board Bill No. \_\_\_\_ effective on  
14 \_\_\_\_\_, 2014 and including the accounts for the 706 Market Redevelopment Project  
15 into which TIF Revenues are from time to time deposited in accordance with the TIF Act and  
16 this Ordinance, including a PILOTS Account and an EATS Account.

17           “Taxable TIF Notes” means any TIF Note, the interest on which (in the opinion of Bond  
18 Counsel), is not exempt from federal income taxation.

19           “Tax-Exempt TIF Notes” means any TIF Note, the interest on which (in the opinion of  
20 Bond Counsel), is exempt from federal income taxation.

21           “TIF Notes” means one or more series of not to exceed \$8,148,000 plus Issuance Costs  
22 Tax Increment Revenue Notes (706 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_\_-A/B issued by  
23 the City pursuant to and subject to the Redevelopment Agreement and this Ordinance in

1 substantially the form set forth in **Exhibit B**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by  
2 reference.

3 “TIF Revenues” means: (1) payments in lieu of taxes (as that term is defined in  
4 Section 99.805(11) of the TIF Act) attributable to the increase in the current equalized assessed  
5 valuation of each taxable lot, block, tract, or parcel of real property located within the  
6 Redevelopment Area over and above the initial equalized assessed value (as that term is used and  
7 described in Sections 99.845.1 and 99.855.1 of the TIF Act) of each such unit of property, as  
8 paid to the City Treasurer by the City Collector of Revenue during the term of the  
9 Redevelopment Plan and the Redevelopment Project, and (2) subject to annual appropriation by  
10 the Board of Aldermen, fifty percent (50%) of the total additional revenues from taxes which are  
11 imposed by the City or other taxing districts (as that term is defined in Section 99.805(16) of the  
12 TIF Act) and which are generated by economic activities within the Redevelopment Area over  
13 the amount of such taxes generated by economic activities within the Redevelopment Area in the  
14 calendar year ending December 31, 2013 (subject to annual appropriation by the City as  
15 provided in the TIF Act), as defined and described in Sections 99.805(4) and 99.845 of the TIF  
16 Act, but excluding therefrom personal property taxes, taxes imposed on sales or charges for  
17 sleeping rooms paid by transient guests of hotels and motels, taxes levied pursuant to  
18 Section 70.500 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended, taxes levied for the purpose of  
19 public transportation pursuant to Section 94.660 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as  
20 amended, and licenses, fees or special assessments other than payments in lieu of taxes and  
21 penalties and interest thereon, all as provided in Section 99.845 of the TIF Act. Notwithstanding  
22 the foregoing, TIF Revenues shall not include the operating levy for school purposes imposed by  
23 or any sales tax imposed by the Transitional School District of the City of St. Louis.

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1 Increment Revenue Notes (706 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_-A”. The Series B  
2 TIF Notes shall be designated “[Taxable]/[Tax-Exempt] Tax Increment Revenue Notes (706  
3 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_-B”. The TIF Notes may have such further  
4 appropriate particular designation added to or incorporated in such title for the TIF Notes of any  
5 particular series as the City may determine.

6 (b) Form of TIF Notes. The TIF Notes shall be substantially in the form set  
7 forth in **Exhibit B**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, with such appropriate  
8 variations, omissions and insertions as are permitted or required by this Ordinance, and may have  
9 endorsed thereon such legends or text as may be necessary or appropriate to conform to any  
10 applicable rules and regulations of any governmental authority or any usage or requirement of  
11 law with respect thereto.

12 (c) Terms of TIF Notes. The TIF Notes shall mature (subject to redemption  
13 and payment prior to maturity as provided in Article III hereof), on the date that is twenty-three  
14 (23) years after the effective date of the Approving Ordinance, which is \_\_\_\_\_.  
15 Each TIF Note shall bear interest at a fixed rate per annum determined on the date that is not less  
16 than ten (10) and not more than sixty (60) business days prior to the scheduled closing date for  
17 issuance of the TIF Notes (the “Pricing Date”) based on the municipal yield curve for general  
18 obligation bonds (the “MMD”) compiled by Municipal Market Data Line ® (or its successors)  
19 and published by Thomson Financial, an operating unit of The Thomson Corporation (or its  
20 successors) using the MMD yield published as of the Issuance Date for general obligation bonds  
21 rated “AAA” that mature in the same year as the TIF Notes, (i) plus four percent (4%) if the  
22 interest on such TIF Note, in the opinion of Bond Counsel, is not exempt from Federal income  
23 taxation (the “Taxable Rate”), or (ii) plus two percent (2%) if the interest on such TIF Note, in

1 the opinion of Bond Counsel, is exempt from Federal income taxation (the “Tax Exempt Rate”);  
2 provided, in no event shall the interest rate on the TIF Notes exceed ten percent (10%) per  
3 annum. All TIF Notes shall have a stated maturity of the Maturity Date. Interest shall be  
4 computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months. The TIF Notes shall bear  
5 interest from their registration date or from the most recent Payment Date to which interest has  
6 been paid or duly provided for.

7 (d) Denominations. The TIF Notes shall be issuable as fully registered TIF  
8 Notes in Authorized Denominations.

9 (e) Numbering. Unless the City directs otherwise, each series of TIF Notes  
10 shall be numbered from R-1 upward.

11 (f) Dating. The TIF Notes shall be dated as provided in **Section 2.7**, as  
12 evidenced by the Finance Officer’s signature on Schedule A to each TIF Note.

13 (g) Evidence of Principal Payments. The payment of principal of the TIF  
14 Notes on each Payment Date shall be noted on the TIF Notes on Schedule A thereto. The  
15 original Schedule A to the TIF Note shall be held by the Finance Officer in trust, unless  
16 otherwise directed in writing by the Owners thereof. If such Schedule A is held by the Finance  
17 Officer, the Finance Officer shall, on each Payment Date, send a revised copy of Schedule A via  
18 facsimile to the Owner. Absent manifest error, the amounts shown on Schedule A held by the  
19 Finance Officer shall be conclusive evidence of the principal amount paid on the TIF Notes.

20 (h) Sale of TIF Notes. When TIF Notes have been executed and authenticated  
21 as required by this Ordinance, the Finance Officer shall hold the TIF Notes in trust or, if directed  
22 in writing by the Owners thereof, deliver the TIF Notes to or upon the order of the Owners  
23 thereof, as provided in paragraph (g) above, but only upon payment to the City of a purchase

1 price equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the face amount of the TIF Notes, which payment  
2 shall be deemed to have occurred under the circumstances described in **Section 4.5** of this  
3 Ordinance.

4 **Section 2.3 Finance Officer to Serve as Paying Agent and Registrar.** The Finance  
5 Officer or the authorized representative thereof is hereby designated as the paying agent  
6 (“Paying Agent”) for the payment of principal of and interest on the TIF Notes and the bond  
7 registrar with respect to the registration, transfer and exchange of the TIF Notes and for  
8 allocating and holding funds as provided herein.

9 **Section 2.4 Security for TIF Notes.** The Series A TIF Notes shall be equally and  
10 ratably secured by Available Revenues. The Series B TIF Notes shall be equally and ratably  
11 secured by the Available Revenues on a subordinate basis to the Series A Notes. The TIF Notes  
12 shall be special, limited obligations of the City payable solely from and secured as to the  
13 payment of principal and interest by a pledge of the Available Revenues. The taxing power of  
14 the City is not pledged to the payment of the TIF Notes either as to principal or interest. The TIF  
15 Notes shall not be or constitute a general obligation of the City, nor shall they constitute an  
16 indebtedness of the City within the meaning of any constitutional, statutory or charter provision,  
17 limitation or restriction. TIF Notes may be issued in two series, with one series subordinate to  
18 TIF Notes of the other series issued hereunder (the “Subordinate Notes”), such that no payment  
19 of principal or interest on any such Subordinate Notes may be made while any TIF Notes are  
20 outstanding. THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE CITY WITH RESPECT TO THE TIF NOTES  
21 SHALL TERMINATE ON THE FIRST TO OCCUR OF THE FULL PAYMENT AND  
22 DISCHARGE OF THE TIF NOTES OR THE MATURITY DATE (WHETHER OR NOT THE  
23 PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OR INTEREST HAS BEEN PAID IN FULL).

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1           **Section 2.5 Method and Place of Payment of TIF Notes.** The principal of and  
2 interest on the TIF Notes shall be payable in any coin or currency which, on the respective dates  
3 of payment thereof, is legal tender for the payment of debts due the United States of America.  
4 Payment shall be made by the Finance Officer as provided in this Note Ordinance and as set  
5 forth in **Exhibit B**. Principal and interest shall be payable by check or draft at the office of the  
6 Finance Officer or by wire transfer to the person in whose name such TIF Note is registered on  
7 the Register on each Payment Date.

8           **Section 2.6 Registration, Transfer and Assignment.** So long as the TIF Notes  
9 remain outstanding, the City shall cause to be kept at the office of the Finance Officer books for  
10 the registration, transfer and exchange of the TIF Notes as herein provided. The TIF Notes when  
11 issued shall be registered in the name of the Original Purchaser thereof on the Register.

12           The TIF Notes and beneficial interest therein may only be purchased by an Original  
13 Purchaser and transferred or assigned to the Developer, a Related Entity, a Qualified Institutional  
14 Buyer or Project Lender upon the execution by each proposed purchaser, transferee or assignee  
15 of a letter in substantially the form of **Exhibit C**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by  
16 reference, stating that such Original Purchaser, transferee or assignee (i) is an Approved Investor  
17 and (ii) has sufficient knowledge and experience in business and financial matters in general, and  
18 investments such as the TIF Notes in particular, to enable the Original Purchaser, transferee or  
19 assignee to evaluate the risks involved in an investment in the TIF Notes. The TIF Notes may be  
20 transferred and exchanged only upon the records of the City. Upon surrender of a TIF Note to the  
21 Finance Officer, the Finance Officer shall transfer or exchange the TIF Notes for a new TIF Note  
22 or TIF Notes, which shall be (i) in the form of fully registered Notes without coupons in  
23 minimum denominations of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000), except with respect to the TIF

1 Notes issued upon acceptance by the City of the final Certificate of Reimbursable  
2 Redevelopment Project Costs, which TIF Notes may be issued in any denomination, subject to  
3 the limitation on the aggregate principal amount, and (ii) of the same Maturity Date and in the  
4 same aggregate principal amount outstanding as the TIF Note which was presented for transfer  
5 or exchange. The TIF Notes presented for transfer or exchange shall be accompanied by a  
6 written instrument or instruments of transfer or authorization for exchange, in a form and with  
7 guarantee of signature satisfactory to the Finance Officer, duly executed by the Owner thereof or  
8 by the Owner's duly authorized agent. Upon any transfer, exchange or assignment as provided  
9 in this Section, the transferor shall reimburse the City for all of the reasonable out-of-pocket  
10 costs incurred by the City in connection with the administration of such transfer, exchange or  
11 assignment.

12 **Section 2.7 Execution, Authentication and Delivery of the TIF Notes.** Each of the  
13 TIF Notes, including any TIF Notes issued in exchange or as substitution for the TIF Notes  
14 initially delivered, shall be signed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and the  
15 Finance Officer of the City, attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the City Register,  
16 and shall have the official seal of the City affixed thereto or imprinted thereon. If any officer  
17 whose signature appears on any TIF Note ceases to be such officer before the delivery of such  
18 TIF Note, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if  
19 such person had remained in office until delivery. Any TIF Note may be signed by such persons  
20 who at the actual time of the execution of such TIF Note are the proper officers to sign such TIF  
21 Note although at the date of such TIF Note such persons may not have been such officers.



1           The Mayor, Finance Officer and City Register are hereby authorized and directed to  
2 prepare and execute the TIF Notes as hereinbefore specified, and when duly executed, to deliver  
3 the TIF Notes to the Finance Officer for authentication.

4           The TIF Notes shall have endorsed thereon a certificate of authentication substantially in  
5 the form set forth in **Schedule A** of **Exhibit B** hereto, which shall be manually executed by an  
6 authorized signatory of the Finance Officer, but it shall not be necessary that the same signatory  
7 sign the certificate of authentication on all of the TIF Notes that may be issued hereunder at any  
8 one time. No TIF Note shall be entitled to any security or benefit under this Ordinance or be  
9 valid or obligatory for any purpose until the certificate of authentication has been duly executed  
10 by the Finance Officer. Such executed certificate of authentication upon any TIF Note shall be  
11 conclusive evidence that such TIF Note has been duly authenticated and delivered under this  
12 Ordinance.

13           The TIF Notes shall be initially executed and authenticated by the City upon the last to  
14 occur of the following: (i) acceptance or deemed acceptance of the Certificate of Substantial  
15 Completion; (ii) approval of a Certificate of Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs; (iii)  
16 receipt of an opinion of Bond Counsel regarding the taxable nature of the TIF Notes; (iv) the full  
17 payment of all advances required to be paid under Section 2.2 of the Redevelopment Agreement;  
18 (v) receipt of such other documentation as the City shall reasonably require of Developer and  
19 any Original Purchaser, in order for the City to obtain an opinion of Bond Counsel as required by  
20 this Section 5.1 of the Redevelopment Agreement; (vi) the completion of Section 4.3 of the  
21 Redevelopment Agreement; and (vii) the determination of the size of the TIF Notes.

22           Upon the Developer's satisfaction of the foregoing conditions and upon approval of each  
23 Certificate of Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs, the Finance Officer shall either: (i) at

1 the request of the City upon instructions of the Developer, endorse an outstanding TIF Note on  
2 Schedule A thereto to evidence an increase in the aggregate principal amount equal to such  
3 Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs, or (ii) at the request of the City upon instructions of  
4 the Developer issue a new TIF Note in a principal amount equal to such Reimbursable  
5 Redevelopment Project Costs, or any combination thereof. Each date of endorsement of each  
6 such TIF Note shall be the date of acceptance by the City of each Certificate of Reimbursable  
7 Redevelopment Project Costs except that the initial endorsement of each TIF Note shall be dated  
8 the Issuance Date of such TIF Note. Thereupon, pursuant to Section 2.2(h), the TIF Notes shall  
9 either be held or delivered to or upon the order of the party submitting the Certificate of  
10 Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs relating to such Notes. Upon acceptance by the City  
11 of such a Certificate of Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs in accordance with the  
12 Redevelopment Agreement and upon execution and authentication of the TIF Notes as required  
13 by this Ordinance, the Developer shall be deemed to have advanced funds to the City in an  
14 amount equal to the purchase price of the TIF Notes, which shall be one hundred percent (100%)  
15 of the face amount of the TIF Notes, and, upon the issuance of an endorsement of the TIF Notes  
16 as provided in the preceding paragraph, the City shall be deemed to have reimbursed the  
17 Developer in full for such Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs.

18 **Section 2.8 Mutilated, Lost and Stolen TIF Notes.** If any mutilated TIF Note is  
19 surrendered to the Finance Officer or the Finance Officer receives evidence to his/her  
20 satisfaction of the destruction, loss or theft of any TIF Note and there is delivered to the Finance  
21 Officer such security or indemnity as may be required by it to save the City and the Finance  
22 Officer harmless, then, in the absence of notice to the Finance Officer that such TIF Note has  
23 been acquired by a bona fide purchaser, the City shall execute and the Finance Officer shall

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1 register and deliver, in exchange for or in lieu of any such mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen TIF  
2 Note, a new TIF Note with the same Maturity Date and of like tenor and principal amount. Upon  
3 the issuance of any new TIF Note under this Section, the City and the Finance Officer may  
4 require the payment by the Owner of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental  
5 charge that may be imposed in relation thereto and any other expenses connected therewith. If  
6 any such mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen TIF Note has become or is about to become due and  
7 payable, the Finance Officer may, in its discretion, pay such TIF Note instead of issuing a new  
8 TIF Note.

9 **Section 2.9 Cancellation, Discharge and Abatement of TIF Notes.** All TIF Notes  
10 that have been paid or redeemed or that otherwise have been surrendered to the Finance Officer,  
11 either at or before the Maturity Date, shall be canceled and destroyed by the Finance Officer in  
12 accordance with existing security regulations upon the payment or redemption of such TIF Note  
13 and the surrender thereof to the Finance Officer. The Finance Officer shall execute a certificate  
14 in duplicate describing the TIF Notes so cancelled and destroyed, and shall file an executed  
15 counterpart of such certificate with the City.

16 **NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION HEREIN TO THE CONTRARY, THE TIF**  
17 **NOTES ARE SUBJECT TO CANCELLATION AND DISCHARGE BY THE CITY IN**  
18 **WHOLE OR IN PART WITHOUT PENALTY UNDER THE CONDITIONS SET**  
19 **FORTH IN THE REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT.**

### ARTICLE III

22

### REDEMPTION AND PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST

1           **Section 3.1 Optional Redemption.** The TIF Notes are subject to optional redemption  
2 by the City in whole at any time or in part on any Payment Date at a redemption price of 100%  
3 of the principal amount of the TIF Note to be redeemed, plus accrued interest thereon to the date  
4 fixed for redemption. The TIF Notes shall be called by the City for optional redemption  
5 pursuant to this Section without the necessity of any action by the City other than as provided in  
6 **Section 4.3** of this Ordinance. If only a partial redemption is to occur, then each TIF Note from  
7 within a Series shall be redeemed in the order of maturity designated by the City, and within any  
8 maturity the TIF Notes shall be redeemed in Authorized Denominations by the City in such  
9 manner as it may determine. In the event of an optional redemption of the Notes, unless waived  
10 by any Registered Owner of Notes to be redeemed, official notice of any redemption shall be  
11 given by the Finance Officer on behalf of the City by mailing a copy of an official redemption  
12 notice by first class mail, postage prepaid, at least thirty (30) days (five days if all of the Notes  
13 are owned by the Developer) and not more than sixty (60) days prior to the date fixed for  
14 redemption, to each Registered Owner of the Notes to be redeemed at the address shown on the  
15 Note Register.

16           All official notices of optional redemption shall be dated and shall contain the following  
17 information: (a) the redemption date; (b) the redemption price; (c) if less than all outstanding  
18 Notes are to be redeemed, the identification number and maturity date(s) (and, in the case of  
19 partial redemption of any Notes, the respective principal amounts) of the Notes to be redeemed;  
20 (d) a statement that on the redemption date the redemption price will become due and payable  
21 upon each Note or portion thereof called for redemption and that interest thereon shall cease to  
22 accrue from and after the redemption date; and (e) the place where such Notes are to be  
23 surrendered for payment of the redemption price, which shall be the office of the Finance

1 Officer. The failure of any Registered Owner to receive notice given as heretofore provided or  
2 an immaterial defect therein shall not invalidate any redemption.

3 **Section 3.2 Special Mandatory Redemption.** All TIF Notes are subject to special  
4 mandatory redemption by the City on each Payment Date, at a redemption price equal to 100%  
5 of the principal amount being redeemed, together with accrued interest thereon to the date fixed  
6 for redemption, which amount of principal being redeemed shall be an amount equal to  
7 Available Revenues then on deposit in the applicable account of the Special Allocation Fund and  
8 which will not be required for the payment of interest on such Payment Date.

9 In the event of a special mandatory redemption of any Notes with a Registered Owner  
10 other than Developer or a Related Entity, unless waived by such Registered Owner of Notes to  
11 be redeemed, official notice of any redemption shall be given by the Finance Officer on behalf of  
12 the City by mailing a copy of an official redemption notice by first class mail, postage prepaid, at  
13 least thirty (30) days and not more than sixty (60) days prior to the date fixed for redemption, to  
14 each Registered Owner other than Developer or a Related Entity of the Notes to be redeemed at  
15 the address shown on the Note Register.

16 **Section 3.3 Selection of Notes to be Redeemed.** TIF Notes shall be redeemed only in  
17 Authorized Denominations. When less than all of the outstanding TIF Notes are to be redeemed  
18 and paid prior to maturity, such TIF Notes or portions of TIF Notes from within the same Series  
19 to be redeemed shall be selected in Authorized Denominations by the Finance Officer in such  
20 equitable manner as it may determine. In the case of a partial redemption of TIF Notes from  
21 within the same Series when TIF Notes of denominations greater than the minimum Authorized  
22 Denomination are then outstanding, then for all purposes in connection with such redemption

1 each Authorized Denomination unit of face value shall be treated as though it was a separate TIF  
2 Note of the denomination of the minimum Authorized Denomination.

3 **Section 3.4 Notice and Effect of Call for Redemption.** In the event of any optional  
4 or special mandatory redemption of the Notes, unless waived by any Registered Owner of Notes  
5 to be redeemed, official notice of any redemption shall be given by the Finance Officer on behalf  
6 of the City by mailing a copy of an official redemption notice by first class mail to each  
7 Registered Owner of the Notes to be redeemed at the address shown on the Note Register.

8 All official notices of redemption shall be dated and shall contain the following  
9 information:

10 (a) the redemption date;

11 (b) the redemption price;

12 (c) if less than all outstanding Notes are to be redeemed, the identification  
13 (and, in the case of partial redemption of any Notes, the respective principal amounts) of the  
14 Notes to be redeemed;

15 (d) a statement that on the redemption date the redemption price will become  
16 due and payable upon each Note or portion thereof called for redemption and that interest  
17 thereon shall cease to accrue from and after the redemption date; and

18 (e) the place where such Notes are to be surrendered for payment of the  
19 redemption price, which shall be the office of the Finance Officer.

20 The failure of any Registered Owner to receive notice given as heretofore provided or an  
21 immaterial defect therein shall not invalidate any redemption. All Notes that have been  
22 redeemed shall be cancelled and destroyed by the Finance Officer as provided herein and shall  
23 not be reissued.

1 **ARTICLE IV**

2 **FUNDS AND REVENUES**

3 **Section 4.1 Creation of Funds and Accounts.** There are hereby created or ratified  
4 and ordered to be established in the treasury of the City the Special Allocation Fund into which  
5 all TIF Revenues shall be deposited, and within it the following separate funds and accounts:

6 (a) PILOTS Account;

7 (b) an EATS Account;

8 (c) a Revenue Fund and, within it, (i) a PILOTS Account; and (ii) an EATS  
9 Account, into which all Available Revenues shall be deposited;

10 (d) a Debt Service Fund, and, within it, (i) a Series A Account; and (ii) a  
11 Series B Account; and

12 (e) a Debt Service Reserve Fund, if established on the Issuance Date; and

13 (f) a Project Fund.

14 **Section 4.2 Administration of Funds and Accounts.** The Special Allocation Fund  
15 and the funds and accounts established therein shall be maintained in the treasury of the City and  
16 administered by the City solely for the purposes and in the manner as provided in the Act, this  
17 Ordinance, the Approving Ordinance, and the Authorizing Ordinance so long as any TIF Notes  
18 remain outstanding hereunder.

19 **Section 4.3 Revenue Fund.**

20 (a) On or before the date that is five (5) days prior to each Payment Date  
21 while the TIF Notes remain outstanding, the City shall transfer and deposit:

22 (i) Those Available Revenues attributable to PILOTS into the  
23 PILOTS Account of the Revenue Fund; and

1 (ii) Those Available Revenues attributable to EATS into the EATS  
2 Account of the Revenue Fund.

3 (b) Available Revenues in the Revenue Fund shall be applied, first from the  
4 EATS Account, and second from the PILOTS Account for the purposes and in the amounts as  
5 follows:

6 *First*, First, to payment of arbitrage rebate, if any, owed with respect to the TIF Notes  
7 under Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, including any costs of  
8 calculating arbitrage rebate;

9 *Second*, to the Finance Officer of the City and the St. Louis Development Corporation  
10 (which monies shall be paid one half to the Finance Officer and one half to the St. Louis  
11 Development Corporation), 0.2% of the Notes outstanding on each Payment Date, plus any  
12 accumulated deficiency from previous years, plus an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion  
13 of the fees and expenses incurred by the City pursuant to Section 7.15 of the Agreement that  
14 have not otherwise been reimbursed to the City through the issuance of TIF Notes;

15 *Third*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all  
16 or any portion of the past due interest owing as a result of prior deficiencies of moneys to pay  
17 interest due on any Series A TIF Notes on each Payment Date;

18 *Fourth*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all  
19 or any portion of the accrued interest becoming due and payable on any Series A TIF Notes on  
20 each Payment Date;

21 *Fifth*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the  
22 interest on the Series A TIF Notes on the next succeeding Payment Date;



1           *Sixth*, for transfer to the Debt Service Reserve Fund, if established, such amount as may  
2 be required to restore any deficiency in the Debt Service Reserve Fund if the amount on deposit  
3 in the Debt Service Reserve Fund is less than the Debt Service Reserve Requirement;

4           *Seventh*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay  
5 the principal of any Series A TIF Notes that are subject to redemption pursuant to the Note  
6 Ordinance on each Payment Date;

7           *Eighth*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service  
8 Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the past due interest owing as a result of  
9 prior deficiencies of moneys to pay interest due on the Series B Note on each Payment Date;

10           *Ninth*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service  
11 Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the accrued interest becoming due and  
12 payable on any Series B Note on each Payment Date;

13           *Tenth*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service  
14 Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the interest on the Series B Notes on the next succeeding  
15 Payment Date;

16           *Eleventh*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt  
17 Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of any Series B Note that is subject to  
18 redemption pursuant to this Note Ordinance on each Payment Date; and

19           *Twelfth*, all other remaining money in the PILOTS Account and the EATS Account of the  
20 Special Allocation Fund shall annually be declared as surplus and distributed in the manner  
21 provided in the TIF Act, as applicable.

1           If monies available in the Special Allocation Fund are insufficient to reimburse the City  
2 as provided above on any Payment Date, then the unpaid portion shall be carried forward to the  
3 next Payment Date, with interest thereon at the same rate as the Series A Notes.

4           (c)     Upon the payment in full of the principal of and interest on all TIF Notes  
5 (or provision has been made for the payment thereof as specified in the Note Ordinance),  
6 payment in full of the fees and expenses of the Finance Officer and the St. Louis Development  
7 Corporation, and payment in full of any other amounts required to be paid under this Ordinance,  
8 all amounts remaining on deposit in the Revenue Fund shall be declared as surplus and  
9 distributed in the manner provided in the Act.

10           **Section 4.4   Debt Service Fund.**

11           (a)     All amounts paid and credited to the Debt Service Fund shall be expended  
12 solely for (i) the payment of the principal of and interest on the TIF Notes as the same mature  
13 and become due or upon the redemption thereof, said TIF Notes all being subject to special  
14 mandatory redemption thereof, or (ii) to purchase Notes for cancellation prior to maturity.

15           (b)     The City hereby authorizes and directs the Finance Officer to withdraw  
16 sufficient moneys from the Debt Service Fund to pay the principal of and interest on the TIF  
17 Notes as the same become due and payable, and to make said moneys so withdrawn available for  
18 the purpose of paying said principal of and interest on the TIF Notes.

19           (c)     After payment in full of the principal of and interest on the TIF Notes (or  
20 provision has been made for the payment thereof as specified in this Ordinance), payment of the  
21 fees and expenses of the Finance Officer, and payment of any other amounts required to be paid  
22 under this Ordinance, all amounts remaining in the Debt Service Fund shall be declared as  
23 surplus and distributed in the manner provided in the Act.

1           **Section 4.5 Project Fund.** Upon acceptance by the City of a Certificate of  
2 Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs and the issuance or endorsement of a TIF Note  
3 pursuant to **Section 2.7** of this Ordinance, the Developer shall be deemed to have advanced  
4 funds necessary to purchase such TIF Note and the City shall be deemed to have deposited such  
5 funds in the Project Fund and shall be deemed to have reimbursed the Developer or paid for in  
6 full for such costs from the amounts deemed to be on deposit in the Project Fund.

7           **Section 4.6 Debt Service Reserve Fund.** Except as herein otherwise provided, funds  
8 on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be used and applied by the Finance Officer  
9 solely to prevent a default in the event moneys on deposit in the Debt Service Fund shall be  
10 insufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Series A Notes as the same become due.  
11 The Finance Officer may disburse and expend moneys from the Debt Service Reserve Fund  
12 whether or not the amount therein equals the Debt Service Reserve Fund Requirement. Moneys  
13 on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund may be used to pay Series A Notes called for  
14 redemption or to purchase Series A Notes in the open market, prior to the Maturity Date,  
15 provided all Notes at the time outstanding are called for redemption or purchased and sufficient  
16 funds are available therefore. Moneys on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be used  
17 to pay and retire the Series A Notes last becoming due, unless such Notes and all interest thereon  
18 are otherwise paid.

19           So long as the sum on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall aggregate an  
20 amount equal to the Debt Service Reserve Fund Requirement, investment earnings on funds on  
21 deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be deposited into the Series A Account of the  
22 Debt Service Fund; provided, however, that if no Series A Notes are then outstanding, such  
23 investment earnings shall be deposited into the Series B Account of the Debt Service Fund. If

1 the sum on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be less than the Debt Service Reserve  
2 Fund Requirement, investment earnings on funds in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall remain  
3 therein and be applied to reducing such deficiency.

4 So long as the sum on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall aggregate an  
5 amount equal to the Debt Service Reserve Fund Requirement on each Payment Date, no further  
6 deposits to said Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be required. Investments and moneys in the  
7 Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be valued at the market value thereof, exclusive of accrued  
8 interest, by the Finance Officer on and the amount on deposit therein determined accordingly.

9 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance to the contrary, to the extent that  
10 any principal or interest on the TIF Obligations remain unpaid on the Maturity Date, any  
11 amounts remaining on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be used to retire pay and  
12 retire any such unpaid TIF Obligations.

13 After payment in full of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Notes (or  
14 provision has been made for the payment thereof as specified in the Ordinance), the fees, charges  
15 and expenses of the Finance Officer and any Paying Agent and any other amounts required to be  
16 paid under the Ordinance or any other instrument entered into with respect to the Notes, all  
17 amounts remaining in the Debt Service Reserve Fund shall be paid to the City.

18 **Section 4.7 Nonpresentment of Notes.** If any TIF Note is not presented for payment  
19 when the principal thereof becomes due at stated maturity or prior redemption date, if funds  
20 sufficient to pay such TIF Note have been made available to the Finance Officer, all liability of  
21 the City to the Registered Owner thereof for the payment of such TIF Note shall forthwith cease,  
22 determine and be completely discharged, and thereupon it shall be the duty of the Finance  
23 Officer to hold such funds, without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the Registered

1 Owner of such TIF Note, who shall thereafter be restricted exclusively to such funds for any  
2 claim of whatever nature on his part under this Ordinance or on, or with respect to, said TIF  
3 Note. If any TIF Note is not presented for payment within five (5) years following the date when  
4 such TIF Note becomes due at maturity, the Finance Officer shall repay to the City the funds  
5 theretofore held by it for payment of such TIF Note, and such TIF Note shall, subject to the  
6 defense of any applicable statute of limitation, thereafter be an unsecured, special limited  
7 obligation of the City, and the Registered Owner thereof shall be entitled to look only to the City  
8 for payment, and then only to the extent of the amount so repaid to it by the Finance Officer, and  
9 the City shall not be liable for any interest thereon and shall not be regarded as a Finance Officer  
10 of such money.

11 **ARTICLE V**

12 **REMEDIES**

13 **Section 5.1 Remedies.** The provisions of this Ordinance, including the covenants and  
14 agreements herein contained, shall constitute a contract between the City and the Owner. The  
15 Owner shall have the right:

16 (a) by mandamus or other suit, action or proceedings at law or in equity to  
17 enforce the rights of the Owner against the City and its officers, agents and employees, and to  
18 require and compel duties and obligations required by the provisions of this Ordinance or by the  
19 constitution and laws of the State of Missouri;

20 (b) by suit, action or other proceedings in equity or at law to require the City,  
21 its officers, agents and employees to account as if they were the trustees of an express trust; and

22 (c) by suit, action or other proceedings in equity or at law to enjoin any acts or  
23 things which may be unlawful or in violation of the rights of the Owner.



1 Finance Officer in trust and shall be applied only in accordance with this Ordinance. The  
2 Finance Officer shall not be under any liability for interest on any moneys received hereunder  
3 except as otherwise provided herein.

4 **Section 6.2 Investment of Moneys.** Moneys held in any fund or account referred to  
5 in this Ordinance shall be invested by the City as set forth in Section 95.530 Revised Statutes of  
6 Missouri, as amended. All earnings on any investments held in any fund shall accrue to and  
7 become a part of such fund or account, except the Debt Service Reserve Fund as provided in  
8 Section 4.6 herein.

9 **ARTICLE VII**

10 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

11 **Section 7.1 Covenant to Request Appropriations.** The City agrees that it shall  
12 comply with its Charter, Article XVI, Section 3 for each fiscal year of the City that the TIF Notes  
13 are outstanding and the City official(s) shall request an appropriation of all moneys on deposit in  
14 the Special Allocation Fund for transfer to the Finance Officer for deposit at the times and in the  
15 manner provided in **Section 4.3** of this Ordinance.

16 **Section 7.2 Tax Matters.** Neither the City nor the Developer shall use or permit the  
17 use of any proceeds of the Tax Exempt TIF Note to acquire any securities or obligations, and  
18 shall not take or permit to be taken any other action or actions, which would cause the Tax  
19 Exempt TIF Note to be an “arbitrage bond” within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Code, or  
20 “federally guaranteed” within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code. The City (to the  
21 extent within its power or discretion) and the Developer shall not use or permit the use of any  
22 proceeds of the Tax Exempt TIF Note, and shall not take or permit to be taken any other action  
23 or actions, which would result in the Tax Exempt TIF Note being treated as other than an

1 obligation described in Section 103(a) of the Code. The City (to the extent within its power or  
2 discretion) and the Developer shall not use any portion of the proceeds of the Tax Exempt TIF  
3 Note, including any investment income earned on such proceeds, in any manner that would cause  
4 the Tax Exempt TIF Note to be a “private activity bond” within the meaning of Section 141(a) of  
5 the Code. The officers of the City, including the Mayor, the Finance Officer and the City  
6 Register, shall be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to execute all documents and take  
7 such actions as they may deem necessary or advisable in order to carry out and perform the  
8 purposes of this Section.

9       **Section 7.3 Payments Due on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays.** In any case where  
10 the Payment Date is a Saturday, a Sunday or a legal holiday or other day that is not a business  
11 day in the City, then payment of principal or interest need not be made on such date but may be  
12 made on the next succeeding business day with the same force and effect as if made on the  
13 Payment Date, and no interest shall accrue for the period after such date.

14       **Section 7.4 Notices, Consents and Other Instruments.** Any notice, consent, request,  
15 direction, approval, objection or other instrument required by this Ordinance to be signed and  
16 executed by the Owner of the TIF Notes may be in any number of concurrent writings of similar  
17 tenor and may be signed or executed by such Owner in person or by agent appointed in writing.  
18 Proof of the execution of any such instrument or of the writing appointing any such agent and of  
19 the ownership of the TIF Note, if made in the following manner, shall be sufficient for any of the  
20 purposes of the Ordinance, and shall be conclusive in favor of the City with regard to any action  
21 taken, suffered or omitted under any such instrument, namely:

22           (a) The fact and date of the execution by any person of any such instrument  
23 may be proved by a certificate of any officer in any jurisdiction who by law has power to take



1 acknowledgments within such jurisdiction that the person signing such instrument acknowledged  
2 before such officer the execution thereof, or by affidavit of any witness to such execution.

3 (b) The fact of ownership of the TIF Note, the amount or amounts and other  
4 identification of the TIF Note, and the date of holding the same shall be proved by the  
5 registration books of the City.

6 **Section 7.5 Execution of Documents; Further Authority.** The City is hereby  
7 authorized to enter into and the Mayor and the Finance Officer of the City are hereby authorized  
8 and directed to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of and as the act and deed of the City, the  
9 TIF Notes and such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or  
10 desirable to carry out and comply with the intent of this Ordinance. The officers of the City,  
11 including without limitation the Mayor, the Finance Officer and the Register, are hereby  
12 authorized and directed to execute, and the City Register is hereby authorized and directed where  
13 appropriate to attest, all certificates, documents or other instruments, and take such actions as  
14 they may deem necessary or advisable in order to carry out and perform the purposes of this  
15 Ordinance and to make ministerial alterations, changes or additions in the foregoing agreements,  
16 statements, instrument and other documents herein approved, authorized and confirmed which  
17 they determine to be in the City's best interest, and the execution or taking of such action shall  
18 be conclusive evidence of such determination.

19 **Section 7.6 Severability.** If any section or other part of this Ordinance, whether large  
20 or small, is for any reason held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of the  
21 other provisions of this Ordinance.

1           **Section 7.7   Governing Law.** This Ordinance shall be governed exclusively by and  
2 constructed in accordance with the applicable internal laws of the State of Missouri without  
3 reference to its conflict of law principles.

4           **Section 7.8   Private Sale.** The Board of Aldermen of the City hereby declares that it is  
5 in the City’s best interest to sell the TIF Notes at private sale because a public sale of the TIF  
6 Notes would cause additional expense to the City and because the condition of the current  
7 financial markets makes such a public sale not feasible or the best course of action for the City.

8           **Section 7.9   Termination.** After adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of  
9 Aldermen, this Ordinance shall become effective on the 30<sup>th</sup> day after its approval by the Mayor  
10 or adoption over his veto; provided that if, within ninety (90) days after the effective date of the  
11 Authorizing Ordinance, the Developer has not (i) executed the Redevelopment Agreement  
12 pertaining to the Redevelopment Project and (ii) paid all fees due to the City in accordance with  
13 the terms of the Redevelopment Agreement, the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed  
14 null and void and of no effect and all rights conferred by this Ordinance on Developer, shall  
15 terminate, provided further, however, that prior to any such termination the Developer may seek  
16 an extension of time in which to execute the Redevelopment Agreement, which extension may  
17 be granted in the sole discretion of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of the City of St.  
18 Louis.

**Legal Description of 706 Market Redevelopment Area**

A parcel of ground being all of Block 185 of the City of St. Louis, Missouri, being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the Southern line of Market Street, 100 feet wide, with the Eastern line of Eighth Street, 68 feet wide; thence South 72 degrees 28 minutes East 259.81 feet along the Southern line of said Market Street to the Western line of Seventh Street, 74 feet wide; thence South 17 degrees 30 1/2 minutes West 118.28 feet along the Western line of said Seventh Street to a point of curve; thence continuing Southwardly 114.83 feet along the Western line of said Seventh Street, along a curve to the right having a radius of 236.79 feet, to a point of compound curve; thence Westwardly 21.75 feet along a curve to the right having a radius of 20.00 feet to a point of tangency in the Northern line of Walnut Street, 68 feet wide; thence North 72 degrees 22 3/4 minutes West 195.44 feet along the Northern line of said Walnut Street to a point of curve; thence Northwardly 31.43 feet along a curve to the right having a radius of 20.00 feet to a point of tangency in the Eastern line of Eighth Street; thence North 17 degrees 40 1/4 minutes East 219.00 feet along the Eastern line of said Eighth Street to the Southern line of the aforesaid Market Street and the point of beginning.



except as otherwise provided herein. The TIF Notes shall bear interest from their registration date or from the most recent Payment Date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for.

Except as otherwise provided herein, the capitalized terms herein shall have the meanings as provided in Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ signed by the Mayor on \_\_\_\_\_, 2014 (the “Note Ordinance”) or the Redevelopment Agreement.

**THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE CITY WITH RESPECT TO THIS TIF NOTE TERMINATE \_\_\_\_\_, WHICH IS TWENTY-THREE YEARS FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE APPROVING THE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT, WHETHER OR NOT THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OR INTEREST HEREON HAS BEEN PAID IN FULL. REFERENCE IS MADE TO THE NOTE ORDINANCE FOR A COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF THE CITY’S OBLIGATIONS HEREUNDER.**

Subject to the preceding paragraph, the principal of and interest on this TIF Note shall be paid at maturity or upon earlier redemption as provided in Article III of the Note Ordinance to the person in whose name this TIF Note is registered at the maturity or redemption date hereof, upon presentation and surrender of this TIF Note at the payment office of the Finance Officer of the City or her authorized agent (the “Finance Officer”). The principal of and interest on the TIF Notes shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, at the respective dates of payment thereof, is legal tender for the payment of debts due the United States of America. The principal of or interest on this TIF Note shall be payable by check or draft or by wire transfer to the person in whose name this TIF Note is registered at the office of the Finance Officer to the Registered Owner on the Register on each Payment Date. Except as otherwise provided in Section 2.8 of the Note Ordinance with respect to mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen TIF Notes, no principal on the TIF Notes is payable unless the Registered Owner thereof has surrendered such TIF Notes at the office of the Finance Officer.

This TIF Note is one of an authorized series of fully registered Notes of the City designated “City of St. Louis, Missouri, [Taxable][Tax-Exempt] Tax Increment Revenue Notes (706 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_\_-A/B,” issued in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$8,148,000 plus Issuance Costs (the “TIF Notes” or “Notes”). The TIF Notes are being issued for the purpose of paying a portion of the Redevelopment Project Costs in connection with the Redevelopment Plan, under the authority of and in full compliance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Missouri, including particularly the Real Property Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, Sections 99.800 to 99.865, of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended (the “Act”), and pursuant to the Note Ordinance.

The TIF Notes and the interest thereon are and shall be special, limited obligations of the City payable solely from and secured as to the payment of principal and interest, by the Available Revenues and other moneys pledged thereto and held by the Finance Officer as provided herein. “Available Revenues” means all monies on deposit from time to time (including investment earnings thereon) in (a) the PILOTS Account; and (b) subject to annual appropriation, the EATS Account that have been appropriated to the repayment of TIF Notes, excluding (i) any amount paid under protest until the protest is withdrawn or resolved against the

taxpayer or (ii) any sum received by the City which is the subject of a suit or other claim communicated to the City which suit or claim challenges the collection of such sum.

The monies on deposit in the PILOTS Account of the Special Allocation Fund are those payments in lieu of taxes (“PILOTS”), as defined in Sections 99.805(11) and 99.845 of the Act) attributable to the increase in the current equalized assessed valuation of each taxable lot, block, tract or parcel of real property in the Redevelopment Area (as described in Exhibit A to the Note Ordinance) and any applicable penalty and interest over and above the initial equalized assessed value (as provided for by Section 99.855 of the Act) of such unit of property in the Redevelopment Area, as allocated and paid to the City’s Treasurer by the City’s Collector of Revenue who shall deposit such PILOTS into the Special Allocation Fund while tax increment financing remains in effect.

The monies on deposit in the EATS Account of the Special Allocation Fund are those amounts subject to annual appropriation by the Board of Aldermen, equal to fifty percent (50%) of the total additional revenues from taxes, penalties and interest which are imposed by the City or other taxing districts (as that term is defined in Section 99.805(16) of the Act) and which are generated by economic activities within the Redevelopment Area over the amount of such taxes generated by economic activities within the Redevelopment Area in the calendar year ending December 31, 2013 (subject to annual appropriation by the City as provided in the Act), while tax increment financing remains in effect, but excluding personal property taxes, taxes imposed on sales or charges for sleeping rooms paid by transient guests of hotels and motels, licenses, fees or special assessments other than payments in lieu of taxes and penalties and interest thereon, taxes levied pursuant to Section 70.500 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended, and taxes levied for the purpose of public transportation pursuant to Section 94.660 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended, all in accordance with Section 99.845.3 of the Act, as may be amended from time to time. Notwithstanding the foregoing, EATS shall not include the operating levy for school purposes imposed by or any sales tax imposed by the Transitional School District of the City of St. Louis.

The Series A TIF Notes shall be equally and ratably secured by Available Revenues. The Series B TIF Notes shall be equally and ratably secured by the Available Revenues on a subordinate basis to the Series A Notes. The TIF Notes shall be special, limited obligations of the City payable solely from and secured as to the payment of principal and interest by a pledge of the Available Revenues. The taxing power of the City is not pledged to the payment of the TIF Notes either as to principal or interest. The TIF Notes shall not be or constitute a general obligation of the City, nor shall they constitute an indebtedness of the City within the meaning of any constitutional, statutory or charter provision, limitation or restriction. THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE CITY WITH RESPECT TO THE TIF NOTES SHALL TERMINATE ON THE FIRST TO OCCUR OF THE FULL PAYMENT AND DISCHARGE OF THE TIF NOTES OR THE MATURITY DATE (WHETHER OR NOT THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OR INTEREST HAS BEEN PAID IN FULL).

Available Revenues shall be applied, first from the EATS Account, and second from the PILOTS Account, to payments on this TIF Note as follows:

*First*, to payment of arbitrage rebate, if any, owed with respect to the TIF Notes under Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, including any costs of calculating arbitrage rebate;

*Second*, to the Finance Officer of the City and the St. Louis Development Corporation (which monies shall be paid one half to the Finance Officer and one half to the St. Louis Development Corporation), 0.2% of the Notes outstanding on each Payment Date, plus any accumulated deficiency from previous years, plus an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the fees and expenses incurred by the City pursuant to Section 7.15 of the Agreement that have not otherwise been reimbursed to the City through the issuance of TIF Notes;

*Third*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the past due interest owing as a result of prior deficiencies of moneys to pay interest due on any Series A TIF Notes on each Payment Date;

*Fourth*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the accrued interest becoming due and payable on any Series A TIF Notes on each Payment Date;

*Fifth*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the interest on the Series A TIF Notes on the next succeeding Payment Date;

*Sixth*, for transfer to the Debt Service Reserve Fund, if established, such amount as may be required to restore any deficiency in the Debt Service Reserve Fund if the amount on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund is less than the Debt Service Reserve Requirement;

*Seventh*, to the Series A Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of any Series A TIF Notes that are subject to redemption pursuant to the Note Ordinance on each Payment Date;

*Eighth*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the past due interest owing as a result of prior deficiencies of moneys to pay interest due on the Series B Note on each Payment Date;

*Ninth*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay all or any portion of the accrued interest becoming due and payable on any Series B Note on each Payment Date;

*Tenth*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the interest on the Series B Notes on the next succeeding Payment Date;

*Eleventh*, if no Series A Notes are outstanding, to the Series B Account of the Debt Service Fund, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of any Series B Note that is subject to redemption pursuant to this Note Ordinance on each Payment Date; and

*Twelfth*, all other remaining money in the PILOTS Account and the EATS Account of the Special Allocation Fund shall annually be declared as surplus and distributed in the manner provided in the TIF Act, as applicable.

Notwithstanding any other provision hereof to the contrary, to the extent that any principal or interest on the TIF Notes remains unpaid on the Maturity Date, any amounts remaining on deposit in the Debt Service Reserve Fund established pursuant to the Note Ordinance shall be used to retire pay and retire any such unpaid TIF Notes.

Upon the payment in full of the principal of and interest on the TIF Notes (or provision has been made for the payment thereof as specified in the Note Ordinance), payment in full of the fees and expenses of the Finance Officer and the St. Louis Development Corporation, and payment in full of any other amounts required to be paid under the Note Ordinance, all amounts remaining on deposit in the Revenue Fund and the Debt Service Fund shall be declared as surplus and distributed in the manner provided in the Act.

The City covenants that it shall comply with the Charter of the City of St. Louis, Article XVI, Section 3 for each fiscal year that TIF Notes are outstanding and the City official(s) shall request an appropriation of all Available Revenues on deposit in the Special Allocation Fund for application to the payment of the principal of (including, but not limited to, payment of a premium, if any) and interest on the TIF Notes.

**NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION HEREIN OR IN THE NOTE ORDINANCE TO THE CONTRARY, THE TIF NOTES ARE SUBJECT TO CANCELLATION AND DISCHARGE BY THE CITY IN WHOLE OR IN PART WITHOUT PENALTY UNDER THE CONDITIONS SET FORTH IN SECTION 7.8 OF THE REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT.**

The TIF Notes are subject to optional redemption by the City in whole at any time or in part on any Payment Date at a redemption price of 100% of the principal amount of the TIF Note to be redeemed, plus accrued interest thereon to the date fixed for redemption.

The TIF Notes are subject to special mandatory redemption by the City on each Payment Date, at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount being redeemed, together with accrued interest thereon to the date fixed for redemption, in an amount equal to Available Revenues on deposit in the applicable accounts of the Special Allocation Fund and which are not required for the payment of accrued interest on such Payment Date.

The TIF Notes or portions of Notes to be redeemed shall become due and payable on the redemption date, at the redemption price therein specified, and from and after the redemption date (unless the City defaults in the payment of the redemption price) such TIF Notes or portion of TIF Notes shall cease to bear interest. Upon surrender of such TIF Notes for redemption in accordance with such notice, the redemption price of such TIF Notes shall be paid by the Finance Officer. Installments of interest due on or prior to the redemption date shall be payable as herein provided for payment of interest. Upon surrender for any partial redemption of any TIF Note, there shall be prepared for the Registered Owner a new TIF Note or Notes of the same maturity in the amount of the unpaid principal as provided herein. All TIF Notes that have been



redeemed shall be cancelled and destroyed by the Finance Officer as provided herein and shall not be reissued.

TIF Notes shall be redeemed only in the principal amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) or any integral multiple thereof. When less than all of the outstanding TIF Notes are to be redeemed and paid prior to maturity, such TIF Notes shall be selected by the Finance Officer in One Thousand Dollar (\$1,000) units of face value in such equitable manner as the Finance Officer may determine.

The TIF Notes are issuable in the form of fully registered Notes without coupons in minimum denominations of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) or any integral multiple \$1,000 in excess thereof, except with respect to the Notes issued upon acceptance by the City of the final Certificate of Reimbursable Redevelopment Project Costs, which Notes may be issued in any denomination, subject to the limitation on the aggregate Principal Amount.

This TIF Note may be transferred or exchanged as provided in the Note Ordinance only upon the Register, upon surrender of this TIF Note together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Finance Officer duly executed by the Registered Owner or the Registered Owner's duly authorized agent.

**THE OWNER HEREOF EXPRESSLY AGREES, BY SUCH OWNER'S ACCEPTANCE HEREOF, THAT THE RIGHT TO PURCHASE, TRANSFER, ASSIGN OR NEGOTIATE THIS TIF NOTE SHALL BE LIMITED TO PURCHASE, TRANSFER, ASSIGNMENT OR NEGOTIATION TO THE DEVELOPER, A RELATED ENTITY A QUALIFIED INSTITUTIONAL BUYER OR PROJECT LENDER, AS SUCH TERMS ARE DEFINED IN THE NOTE ORDINANCE, AND UPON THE EXECUTION BY THE PROPOSED PURCHASER OR TRANSFEREE OF AN INVESTMENT LETTER IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FORM OF EXHIBIT C TO THE NOTE ORDINANCE, SIGNED BY THE PROPOSED PURCHASER OR TRANSFEREE, SHOWING THAT THE PROPOSED PURCHASER OR TRANSFEREE IS AN APPROVED INVESTOR. "Approved Investor" is defined in the Note Ordinance, and includes, among others, (a) the Developer or a Related Entity, (b) an "accredited investor" under Rule 501(a) of Regulation D promulgated under the Securities Act of 1933, (c) a "qualified institutional buyer" under Rule 144A promulgated under the Securities Act of 1933 or (d) any general business company or enterprise with total assets in excess of \$50,000,000.**

Subject to the limitations of the preceding paragraph, upon surrender thereof at the office of the Finance Officer, the Finance Officer shall transfer or exchange any TIF Note for a new TIF Note of the same maturity and in the same principal amount as the outstanding principal amount of the TIF Note that was presented for transfer or exchange. Any TIF Note presented for transfer or exchange shall be accompanied by a written instrument or instruments of transfer or authorization for exchange, in a form and with guarantee of signature satisfactory to the Finance Officer, duly executed by the Registered Owner thereof or by the Registered Owner's duly authorized agent.

This TIF Note shall not be valid or binding on the City or be entitled to any security or benefit under the Indenture until the Certificate of Authentication hereon has been executed by the Finance Officer.

**IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND DECLARED** that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, happen and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of the TIF Notes have existed, happened and been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law.

This letter is to provide you with certain representations and agreements with respect to the purchase by the undersigned of not to exceed \$8,148,000 (plus Issuance Costs) aggregate principal amount of Tax Increment Revenue Notes, (706 Market Redevelopment Project), Series 20\_\_-A/B (the "TIF Notes"), issued by the City of St. Louis, Missouri (the "City"). The TIF Notes are secured in the manner set forth in Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ Board Bill No. \_\_\_\_\_ of the City adopted on \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_ (the "Note Ordinance"). The undersigned hereby represents to each of you and agrees with each of you, as follows:

1. The undersigned is an Approved Investor (as defined in the Note Ordinance) and has reviewed the Note Ordinance.

2. The undersigned acknowledges that neither the City nor its financial advisor has not made any representation or warranty concerning the accuracy or completeness of any information furnished in connection with the purchase by the undersigned of the TIF Notes. Accordingly, the undersigned has not relied upon the City or its financial advisor as to the accuracy or completeness of such information. As a sophisticated and/or investor, the undersigned has made its own decision to purchase the TIF Notes based solely upon its own inquiry and analysis.

3. The undersigned understands that (i) the TIF Notes do not constitute an indebtedness of the City or a loan or credit thereof within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory debt limitation or restriction, (ii) the TIF Notes are payable solely from and secured by a pledge of Available Revenues (as defined in the Note Ordinance) and (iii) the City's special, limited obligation with respect to the TIF Notes terminates on the first to occur of the full payment and discharge of the TIF Notes or the Maturity Date, whether or not the principal or interest has been paid in full.

4. The undersigned is familiar with and has counsel who are familiar with the federal and state legislation, rules, regulations and case law pertaining to the transfer and distribution of securities, including, but not limited to, disclosure obligations of the seller incident to any such transfer or distribution. The undersigned hereby covenants and agrees that the undersigned will not sell, offer for sale, pledge, transfer, convey, hypothecate, mortgage or dispose of the TIF Notes or any interest therein in violation of applicable federal or state law or in violation of restrictions on sale, assignment, negotiation or transfer of the TIF Notes as set forth in paragraph 6 below.

5. The undersigned is purchasing the TIF Notes for its own account for investment (and not on behalf of another) and, other than a contemplated pledge of the TIF Notes, has no present intention of reselling the TIF Notes or dividing its interest therein. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the undersigned has the right to sell, offer for sale, pledge, transfer, convey, hypothecate, mortgage or dispose of the TIF Notes at some future date determined by it, provided that such disposition is not in violation of restrictions on sale, assignment, negotiation or transfer of the TIF Notes as set forth in paragraph 6 below.

6. The undersigned acknowledges that the right to sell, assign, negotiate or otherwise transfer the TIF Notes shall be limited to Approved Investors (as defined in the Note Ordinance).

7. The undersigned agrees to indemnify and hold you harmless from any and all claims, judgments, attorneys' fees and expenses of whatsoever nature, whether relating to litigation or otherwise, resulting from any attempted or affected sale, offer for sale, pledge, transfer, conveyance, hypothecation, mortgage or disposition of the TIF Notes in violation of this letter.

8. The undersigned has satisfied itself that the TIF Notes may be legally purchased by the undersigned.
