

**BOARD BILL NO. 119AA INTRODUCED BY: ALDERMAN TERRY KENNEDY,
ALDERMAN JOHN MUHAMMAD, ALDERMAN JEFFREY BOYD, ALDERMAN JOE
VACCARO**

1 An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Public Safety, on behalf of the
2 Mayor and the City of Saint Louis, to enter into and execute an Intergovernmental Agreement
3 with the United States Marshal Service for housing and related services for United States
4 Marshal detainees housed within the Division of Corrections, providing for appropriation of
5 these funds paid by the United States Marshals Service in accordance with the
6 Intergovernmental Agreement, authorizing the expenditure of such appropriated funds by
7 entering into contracts or otherwise upon approval of the Board of Estimate and
8 Apportionment, and containing an emergency clause.

9 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

10 **SECTION ONE.** The Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed, on
11 behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute an Intergovernmental Agreement
12 with the United States Marshals Service for housing and related services for federal detainees
13 subject to approval by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

14 **SECTION TWO.** The Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed to
15 invoice the United States Marshals Service in accordance with the provisions of the
16 Intergovernmental Agreement.

17 **SECTION THREE.** Upon receipt of payments, the Director of Public Safety is
18 hereby authorized and directed, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment,
19 to deposit [~~forty~~ thirty] percent (~~[40]~~ 30%) of such funds to the General Fund and [~~sixty~~]
20 seventy] percent (~~[60]~~ 70%) of such funds to a special fund for the purpose of providing

1 funding for improvements to the City's jail facilities, including but not limited to security
2 upgrades, facilities, grounds and other improvements, equipment and capital assets.

3 **SECTION FOUR.** Emergency Clause. This being an Ordinance for the immediate
4 preservation of public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an immediate
5 measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of
6 St. Louis and therefore this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage
7 and approval by the Mayor.
