

BOARD BILL #119 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN KENNEDY, ALDERMAN J. BOYD,  
ALDERMAN VACCARO, ALDERMAN MUHAMMAD

1 An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Public Safety, on behalf of the Mayor  
2 and the City of Saint Louis, to enter into and execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the  
3 United States Marshal Service for housing and related services for United States Marshal  
4 detainees housed within the Division of Corrections, providing for appropriation of these funds  
5 paid by the United States Marshals Service in accordance with the Intergovernmental  
6 Agreement, authorizing the expenditure of such appropriated funds by entering into contracts or  
7 otherwise upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, and containing an  
8 emergency clause.

9 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

10 **SECTION ONE.** The Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf  
11 of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the  
12 United States Marshals Service for housing and related services for federal detainees subject to  
13 approval by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

14 **SECTION TWO.** The Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed to invoice  
15 the United States Marshals Service in accordance with the provisions of the Intergovernmental  
16 Agreement.

17 **SECTION THREE.** Upon receipt of payments, the Director of Public Safety is hereby  
18 authorized and directed, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to deposit  
19 forty percent (40%) of such funds to the General Fund and sixty percent (60%) of such funds to a  
20 special fund for the purpose of providing funding for improvements to the City's jail facilities,

21 including but not limited to security upgrades, facilities, grounds and other improvements,  
22 equipment and capital assets.

23 **SECTION FOUR.** Emergency Clause. This being an Ordinance for the immediate preservation  
24 of public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an immediate measure within the  
25 meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore  
26 this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
