9 An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of the City of St. Louis Department  
10 of Health to enter into and execute an Opioid Crisis Response Services Contract with the  
11 Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services in order to help to fund some personnel  
12 costs, auto travel reimbursement and equipment/supplies for a Crisis Resource Response Team,  
13 upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, and to expend funds by entering  
14 into contracts or otherwise for the Opioid Crisis Response Services Contract purposes and  
15 containing an emergency clause.

16 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

17 **SECTION ONE.** The Director of the City of St. Louis Department of Health is hereby  
18 authorized and directed to enter into and execute an Opioid Crisis Response Services Contract  
19 with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services in order to help to fund some  
20 personnel costs, auto travel reimbursement and equipment/supplies for a Crisis Resource  
21 Response Team.

22 **SECTION TWO.** The Director of the City of St. Louis Department of Health is hereby  
23 authorized and directed, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend  
24 the funds, which are hereby appropriated for said purpose, by entering into contracts or otherwise  
25 received pursuant to the Opioid Crisis Response Services Contract with the Missouri Department

1 of Health and Senior Services, totaling \$90,299, in a manner that is consistent with the  
2 provisions of said Contract.

3 **SECTION THREE.** Emergency Clause.

4 This being an ordinance for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, it is  
5 hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning of Sections 19 & 20 of Article  
6 IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis, and therefore, this ordinance shall become effective  
7 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
