The United States government recently has enacted legislation appropriating additional funding for City activities and expenses related to the COVID-19 pandemic. In this Ordinance, the Board of Aldermen authorizes the Mayor or his or her designees to apply for and accept funds received from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, § 9901 (March 11, 2021), directs the Comptroller to establish a new account for the receipt of funds (solely to the extent received), appropriates the funds (solely to the extent received); containing a severability clause; and containing an emergency clause. Appropriation of this funding will greatly benefit the public by providing additional resources for addressing housing instability and public health and welfare.

1 An Ordinance recommended by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and
2 authorizing the Mayor, or her designees, to apply for and accept funds pursuant to Federal
3 appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, § 9901 (March
4 11, 2021), directing the Comptroller to establish a new account for the receipt of funds, to the
5 extent received, appropriating the funds, to the extent received; and containing an emergency
6 clause.

7 **WHEREAS**, Article XIII, Section 14-C(c) of the Charter of the City of St. Louis
8 provides that “whenever any malignant, infectious, or contagious disease is threatened or is
9 prevalent in the city, on proclamation thereof by the mayor and with the approval of the mayor
10 and the director of health and hospitals, the health commissioner may take such steps, use such
11 measures, and incur such expense as he deems necessary to avoid, suppress, or mitigate such
12 disease until the mayor proclaims the need therefor ended, notwithstanding anything to the
13 contrary in this charter or in any ordinance”; and

14 **WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, the Mayor issued a proclamation that a malignant,
15 infectious, or contagious disease, namely COVID-19, was threatened in the City; and

16 **WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020 and thereafter, the Director of Health and Hospitals and
17 Health Commissioner issued Orders to the public restricting activities, supervised the medical
18 testing and quarantine activities to reduce contagion, and entered into contracts for emergency
19 purchases of supplies and provision of services to avoid, suppress, and mitigate COVID-19; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the Department of Health and Hospitals and other City Departments and
2 agencies have incurred and continue to incur substantial expenses due to COVID-19 related
3 actions, and such expenses remain unanticipated; and

4 **WHEREAS**, the City has received Two Hundred Forty-Nine Million Thirty-Eight
5 Thousand Twenty-Seven Dollars (\$249,038,027.00) of relief funds (the Initial ARPA Funds)
6 from the Federal Government pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No.
7 117-2, § 9901 (March 11, 2021) (the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund); and

8 **WHEREAS**, the City has applied for and anticipates receipt of Twelve Million Four
9 Hundred Forty-One Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Eight and 20/100ths Dollars
10 (\$12,441,998.20) in Emergency Rental Assistance Program Funds from the Federal Government
11 appropriated in ARPA (the ERA-2 Funds); and

12 **WHEREAS**, the Federal Government has issued guidance for the Coronavirus State and
13 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the ERA-2 Funds, and the Federal Government may issue
14 additional guidance on the use of such relief funding in the future; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the use of Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and ERA-2 Funds
16 must adhere to Federal guidance that has been and will be issued on the use of ARPA Funds and
17 the City’s associated requirements; and

18 **WHEREAS**, monies acquired under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund can be
19 used “(A) to respond to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease
20 2019 (COVID-19) or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small
21 businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;

1 (B) to respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID–19 public health
2 emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers of the metropolitan city,
3 nonentitlement unit of local government, or county that are performing such essential work, or
4 by providing grants to eligible employers that have eligible workers who perform essential work;
5 (C) for the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue of such
6 metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county due to the COVID–19
7 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year of the
8 metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county prior to the emergency; or
9 (D) to make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure”;

10 **WHEREAS**, there is an immediate and urgent need to meet the governmental, human,
11 and business crises as quickly and effectively as possible.

12 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

13 **SECTION ONE.** The City, by and through the Mayor, or her designees, is hereby
14 authorized to apply for and accept the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the
15 ERA-2 Funds to the full extent permitted under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

16 **SECTION TWO.** The Comptroller of the City of St. Louis is hereby authorized and
17 directed to establish an account (Rescue Fund), in which shall be deposited the 2021
18 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the ERA-2 Funds. All monies received hereby
19 shall be deposited in this fund upon receipt, in accordance with federal law and regulations, and
20 shall be appropriated, to the extent funds are received, in accordance with the provisions of this

1 ordinance, in accordance with **Exhibit 1**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by
2 reference.

3 **SECTION THREE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-Two Million Eight
4 Hundred Eighty-Six Thousand Dollars Three Hundred Seventy Million Dollars (\$22,886,370.00) of
5 the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Department of Human Services. The
6 Director of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and
7 execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, and
8 to expend such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller
9 is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all
10 expenditures, authorized in this Section. The total amount of Rescue Funds for which the
11 Comptroller may issue warrants shall not exceed the total appropriation of Rescue Funds herein.

12 **SECTION FOUR.** There are hereby appropriated Twelve Million Four Hundred Forty-
13 One Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Eight and 20/100th Dollars (\$12,442,998.20) of the ERA-2
14 Funds (to the extent received) to the Department of Human Services. The Director of the
15 Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all
16 contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, and to expend such
17 funds (to the extent received) on behalf of the City for the purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The
18 Director of the Department of Human Services is authorized to execute on behalf of the City an
19 intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the SLHA Cooperation Agreement) with the St. Louis
20 Housing Authority (SLHA) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to the total sum of ERA-
21 2 Funds to SLHA for disbursement to eligible recipients and which shall require SLHA to:

1 provide and support the online portal for intake of applications by City residents for rental and
2 utility assistance funds; provide technical assistance to the City, City contractors/subrecipients,
3 and applicants in the use of the online application portal and the distribution of funds; monitor
4 financial transactions originated through the portal; provide quarterly reporting to the City on
5 applications submitted, applications approved, and disbursements made; and comply with
6 recordkeeping and other requirements for 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and
7 ERA-2 Funds, as applicable, and all applicable City, State, and Federal Laws and regulations.

8 The SLHA Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other terms and conditions as are
9 approved by the City Counselor and shall require approval of the Board of Commissioners of the
10 SLHA prior to execution. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the
11 City Treasury for payment of all expenditures and transfers authorized in the Section, to the
12 extent funds are received, provided that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds
13 appropriated by this Section.

14 **SECTION FIVE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Five Million Six Hundred
15 Thousand Dollars (\$5,600,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the
16 Affordable Housing Commission s. The Executive Director of the Affordable Housing
17 Commission or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and
18 all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, on behalf of the City
19 for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
20 upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section. The total

1 amount of Rescue Funds for which the Comptroller may issue warrants shall not exceed the total
2 appropriation of Rescue Funds herein.

3 **SECTION SIX.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Sixty Two Million Five
4 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$62,550,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal
5 Recovery Funds to the St. Louis Development Corporation. The Executive Director of the St.
6 Louis Development Corporation or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate,
7 and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds
8 and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. This
9 funding includes funds to build wealth and community along four areas comprising 8.5 miles of
10 historically underserved North St. Louis Commercial Corridors, by providing grants to stabilize
11 small businesses and economic development non-profits, as well as grants to cover a percentage
12 of costs for business development projects, when paired with funds by the applicant
13 entrepreneur. There are hereby established the following four North St. Louis Commercial
14 Corridors. The Martin Luther King Drive Commercial Corridor will consist of Dr. Martin Luther
15 King Drive bounded by the City Limit of the City of Wellston, Missouri and Jefferson Avenue.
16 The Grand Boulevard Commercial Corridor will consist of Grand Boulevard as bounded by
17 Cottage Avenue and Hebert Avenue. The West Florissant Commercial Corridor which will
18 consist of West Florissant Avenue bounded by Acme to Union Boulevard. The Natural Bridge
19 Commercial Corridor will consist of Natural Bridge Avenue bounded by Kingshighway to
20 Vandeventer. Small business owners, property owners, landlords, and nonprofits can apply for a
21 grant from these funds to cover 30 percent (for new construction) or 50 percent (for rehab) of

1 total costs for a business development project within one of the Northside Commercial corridors.
2 Applicants must be able to pair the funds provided by the city with their own funds, whether
3 raised from debt or equity, and fulfill three conditions. First, the project must be located within
4 one of the four defined North St. Louis Commercial Corridors as described in this ordinance.
5 Second, the project must be a building improvement or development. Third, the project must
6 enhance retail or cultural offerings in the community. An Advisory Committee will be appointed
7 for each North St. Louis Commercial Corridor. Advisory Committee members must live within
8 one mile of the North St. Louis Commercial Corridor's committee that they would serve on.
9 Advisory Committee members will be selected by the Alderperson or Alderpersons whose
10 ward(s) contain the Commercial Corridor. Advisory Committees can be up to twelve members,
11 with at least two members selected by each Alderman that contains a section of that Commercial
12 Corridor as defined in this ordinance. The St. Louis Development Corporation (SLDC) will
13 manage the program and fund. Administration of and compliance to the program may be paid for
14 with money within the fund. SLDC will conduct initial vetting of the applications for financial
15 and project feasibility, manages all required program documentation, and works directly with
16 grantees to move their projects ahead. These functions may be outsourced by SLDC with
17 approval by the Board of Aldermen through a Resolution. Projects with total costs below
18 \$175,000 will be reviewed by SLDC and the Advisory Committee of the subject Commercial
19 Corridor. Advisory Committee members must live within one mile of a North St. Louis
20 Commercial Corridor. Projects above \$175,000 will be reviewed by SLDC and will require
21 individual approval by the Board of Aldermen. and require individual approval from the city

1 council. Application for grants will be reviewed based on Project Readiness, Catalytic Impact,
2 and recommendation of the Advisory Committee. Assessment of Project Readiness will be based
3 on factors such as Site Control, Property Status including any encumbrances, Project Budget and
4 other financing, Construction plan readiness. Assessment of Catalytic Impact will be bases on
5 community input and whether the intended use fills a gap or need in the neighborhood or will
6 draw people to the community. Recommendation from the Commercial Corridor’s Advisory
7 Committee will be considered in making any final decisions. If an entrepreneur applicant lives
8 within two miles of the Northside Commercial Corridor, he or she will be eligible for an
9 additional fifteen percent of total project costs in grant funding during the development phase of
10 the project. If an entrepreneur applicant does not live within two miles of the Northside
11 Commercial Corridor and hires at least two individuals that do live within two miles of the
12 Northside Commercial Corridor their business is located in, he or she will be eligible for one
13 year of salary reimbursement for those individuals up to 15% of the total project costs. Once a
14 grant is awarded, SLDC will work with the entrepreneurs to help them draw resources from the
15 grant, secure outstanding resources and finances, obtain building permits and any necessary city
16 licenses. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for
17 payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed
18 the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section

19 **SECTION SEVEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-Two Million
20 Dollars (\$22,000,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the
21 Community Development Administration. The Director of the Community Development

1 Administration or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any
2 and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend
3 such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes allowed under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal
4 Recovery Fund and as described in **Exhibit 1**. The Executive Director of the of the Community
5 Development Administration or his or her designee is authorized to to execute on behalf of the
6 City two intergovernmental cooperation agreements (the SLMHB Cooperation Agreements)
7 with the St. Louis Mental Health Board (SLMHB) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to
8 Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,00) to SLMHB to support providers of early childhood education
9 and childcare, and up to One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) to SLMHB
10 to support providers of direct support care work as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The SLMHB
11 Cooperation Agreements shall require SLMHB to comply with recordkeeping and other
12 requirements of the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Assistance Fund program and all
13 applicable City, State, and Federal laws and regulations; and acknowledge and agree that funding
14 for the SLMHB Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other terms and conditions as are
15 approve by the City Counselor and shall require approval of the Board of Trustees of the
16 SLMHB prior to execution. The Executive Director of the Community Development
17 Administration or his or her designee is authorized to execute on behalf of the City an
18 intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the SLPL Cooperation Agreement) with the City of
19 St. Louis Municipal Library District (SLPL) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to Two
20 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) to SLPL for digital literacy education and
21 community outreach programs as shown on **Exhibit 1**. The SIP Cooperation Agreement shall

1 require SLPL to comply with recordkeeping and other requirements of the Coronavirus Local
2 Fiscal Recovery Assistance Fund program and all applicable City, State, and Federal laws and
3 regulations; and acknowledge and agree that funding for the SLPL Cooperation Agreement is
4 limited to these appropriated funds. The SLPL Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other
5 terms and conditions as are approved by the City Counselor and shall require approval of the
6 Board of Directors of SLPL, prior to execution by the City. The Comptroller is authorized and
7 directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in
8 this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by
9 this Section. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
10 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
11 exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

12 **SECTION EIGHT.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Eleven Million Two
13 Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$11,250,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal
14 Recovery Funds to the Department of Health. The Director of the Department of Health or his or
15 her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other
16 documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the
17 City for purposes allowed under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, as described in
18 **Exhibit 1.** The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
19 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
20 exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

1 **SECTION NINE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of One Million Seven Hundred
2 Fourteen Thousand and One Hundred Dollars (\$1,741,100.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local
3 Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry. The Director of the
4 Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry or his or her designee is hereby authorized to
5 make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to
6 expend such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes described in
7 **Exhibit 1.** The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
8 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
9 exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

10 **SECTION TEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Five Million Three Hundred
11 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$5,350,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the
12 Department of St. Louis Agency on Training and Employment. The Director of the St. Louis
13 Agency on Training and Employment or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make,
14 negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend
15 such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1.**
16 The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment
17 of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total
18 amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

19 **SECTION ELEVEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Seven Hundred Sixty-
20 Two Thousand and Fifty Dollars (\$762,050) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery
21 Fund to the Information Technology Services Agency. The Director of ITSA or his or her

1 designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other
2 documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the
3 City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue
4 warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section
5 provided that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

6 **SECTION TWELVE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of One Million Dollars
7 (\$1,000,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the Planning and Urban
8 Design Agency. The Director of the Planning and Urban Design Agency or his or her designee is
9 hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on
10 behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for
11 purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
12 upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that
13 such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section

14 **SECTION THIRTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Two Million Five
15 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to
16 the Board of Public Service. The President of the Board of Public Service or his or her designee
17 is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on
18 behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for
19 purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
20 upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that
21 such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

1 **SECTION FOURTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Five Hundred and
2 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the
3 Office of the Comptroller. The Comptroller or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make,
4 negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend
5 such funds and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**.
6 The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment
7 of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total
8 amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

9 **SECTION FIFTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Three Hundred
10 Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars (\$312,500) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery
11 Fund to The Office of the Mayor. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and
12 execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and
13 to expend such funds on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller
14 is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all
15 expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total
16 amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

17 **SECTION SIXTEEN.** In order to ensure the efficiency, effectiveness, equity, and
18 transparency of the use of taxpayer funds and relief programs to address the coronavirus
19 pandemic, on or before the 10th of each month after this bill passes, and ending in April 2023,
20 the Mayor’s office shall present to the Board of Aldermen’s Housing, Urban Development and
21 Zoning Committee and provide a written report regarding planned expenditures and detailing

1 expenditures made to date. The plan should detail how data will help make inform decisions and
2 are in line with health equity principles addressing COVID 19, including but not limited to:
3 collecting, analyzing, and reporting data disaggregated by age, race, ethnicity, gender, disability,
4 neighborhood, and other sociodemographic characteristics; including the people most affected
5 by health and economic challenges in the decision making process; promoting racial equity in
6 response and recovery efforts; and strengthening public health, health care, and social
7 infrastructure that foster resilience. Reports should update plans and procedures for redirecting
8 and targeting resources based on emerging data trends that identify disparities. The report shall
9 also be posted on the City’s website.

10 **SECTION SEVENTEEN.** In the event the City of St. Louis uses federal funds to
11 expand or create Intentional Encampments as outlined in **Exhibit 1** of this ordinance, no such
12 use shall occur in the areas or any portion thereof that lies within the following boundaries of the
13 following wards:

14 **Ward 2**

15 Beginning at the point of intersection of Mullanphy St and the Mississippi River, and proceeding
16 westerly along Mullanphy St to N 7th St, and proceeding northerly along N 7th St to N
17 Broadway, and proceeding northerly along N Broadway to Brooklyn St, and proceeding westerly
18 along Brooklyn St to N 10th St, and proceeding northerly along N 10th St to Chambers St, and
19 proceeding easterly along Chambers St to N 1st St, and proceeding northerly along N 1st St to N
20 Market St, and proceeding easterly along N Market St to N Wharf St, and proceeding northerly

1 along N Wharf St to Branch St, and proceeding westerly along Branch St to N 9th St, and
2 proceeding southerly along N 9th St to Montgomery St, and proceeding westerly along
3 Montgomery St to I-70, and proceeding northerly along I-70 to E Grand Ave, and proceeding
4 westerly along E Grand to Blair Ave, and proceeding northerly along Blair Ave to Linton Ave,
5 and proceeding westerly along Linton Ave to Conde St, and proceeding northerly along Conde
6 St to E College Ave, and proceeding easterly along E College Ave to Von Phul St, and
7 proceeding northerly along Von Phul St to Adelaide Ave, and proceeding easterly along
8 Adelaide Ave to I- 70, and proceeding westerly along I- 70 to W Florissant Ave, and proceeding
9 westerly along W Florissant Ave to Calvary Ave, and proceeding easterly along Calvary Ave to
10 Broadway, and proceeding northerly along Broadway to Norfolk and Western Rlwy, and
11 proceeding westerly along Norfolk and Western Rlwy to Riverview Blvd, and proceeding

9 **SECTION EIGHTEEN.** Conflicts of Interest. To ensure the selection of providers based on

11 process in accordance with Ordinance 64102, the Rules and Procedures for Professional Services
12 Agreement established by the Board of Public Service, and 2 CFR 200, the Uniform
13 Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.
14 Additionally, all recipients of ARPA funds must affirm their compliance through a
15 conflict of interest form subject to verification by the Comptroller. Any marketing materials
16 related to the funds outlined in this ordinance shall not share the image, name or likeness of any
17 elected official in the City of St. Louis.

18 **SECTION NINETEEN.** Emergency Clause. Delay in receipt and appropriation of these
19 monies will increase threats to the public health and welfare by causing delay in responding to
20 the COVID-19 crisis. This being an ordinance appropriated for emergency funding for current
21 expenses of the City government, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the

1 meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and shall
2 become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

3 **SECTION TWENTY**

4 There are hereby appropriated Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus
5 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Police Department for the purpose of Police Department
6 Overtime (Account 6505172).
