The United States government recently has enacted legislation appropriating additional funding for City activities and expenses related to the COVID-19 pandemic. In this Ordinance, the Board of Aldermen authorizes the Mayor or his or her designees to apply for and accept funds received from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, § 9901 (March 11, 2021), directs the Comptroller to establish a new account for the receipt of funds (solely to the extent received), appropriates the funds (solely to the extent received); containing a severability clause; and containing an emergency clause. Appropriation of this funding will greatly benefit the public by providing additional resources for addressing housing instability and public health and welfare.

1 An Ordinance recommended by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and
2 authorizing the Mayor, or her designees, to apply for and accept funds pursuant to Federal
3 appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, § 9901 (March
4 11, 2021), directing the Comptroller to establish a new account for the receipt of funds, to the
5 extent received, appropriating the funds, to the extent received; and containing an emergency
6 clause.

7 **WHEREAS**, Article XIII, Section 14-C(c) of the Charter of the City of St. Louis
8 provides that “whenever any malignant, infectious, or contagious disease is threatened or is
9 prevalent in the city, on proclamation thereof by the mayor and with the approval of the mayor
10 and the director of health and hospitals, the health commissioner may take such steps, use such
11 measures, and incur such expense as he deems necessary to avoid, suppress, or mitigate such
12 disease until the mayor proclaims the need therefor ended, notwithstanding anything to the
13 contrary in this charter or in any ordinance”; and

14 **WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, the Mayor issued a proclamation that a malignant,
15 infectious, or contagious disease, namely COVID-19, was threatened in the City; and

16 **WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020 and thereafter, the Director of Health and Hospitals and
17 Health Commissioner issued Orders to the public restricting activities, supervised the medical
18 testing and quarantine activities to reduce contagion, and entered into contracts for emergency
19 purchases of supplies and provision of services to avoid, suppress, and mitigate COVID-19; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the Department of Health and Hospitals and other City Departments and
2 agencies have incurred and continue to incur substantial expenses due to COVID-19 related
3 actions, and such expenses remain unanticipated; and

4 **WHEREAS**, the City has received Two Hundred Forty-Nine Million Thirty-Eight
5 Thousand Twenty-Seven Dollars (\$249,038,027.00) of relief funds (the Initial ARPA Funds)
6 from the Federal Government pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No.
7 117-2, § 9901 (March 11, 2021) (the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund); and

8 **WHEREAS**, the City has applied for and anticipates receipt of Twelve Million Four
9 Hundred Forty-One Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Eight and 20/100ths Dollars
10 (\$12,441,998.20) in Emergency Rental Assistance Program Funds from the Federal Government
11 appropriated in ARPA (the ERA-2 Funds); and

12 **WHEREAS**, the Federal Government has issued guidance for the Coronavirus State and
13 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the ERA-2 Funds, and the Federal Government may issue
14 additional guidance on the use of such relief funding in the future; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the use of Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and ERA-2 Funds
16 must adhere to Federal guidance that has been and will be issued on the use of ARPA Funds and
17 the City’s associated requirements; and

18 **WHEREAS**, monies acquired under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund can be
19 used “(A) to respond to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease
20 2019 (COVID-19) or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small
21 businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;

1 (B) to respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID–19 public health
2 emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers of the metropolitan city,
3 nonentitlement unit of local government, or county that are performing such essential work, or
4 by providing grants to eligible employers that have eligible workers who perform essential work;
5 (C) for the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue of such
6 metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county due to the COVID–19
7 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year of the
8 metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county prior to the emergency; or
9 (D) to make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure”;

10 **WHEREAS**, there is an immediate and urgent need to meet the governmental, human,
11 and business crises as quickly and effectively as possible.

12 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

13 **SECTION ONE.** The City, by and through the Mayor, or her designees, is hereby
14 authorized to apply for and accept the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the
15 ERA-2 Funds to the full extent permitted under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

16 **SECTION TWO.** The Comptroller of the City of St. Louis is hereby authorized and
17 directed to establish an account (Rescue Fund), in which shall be deposited the 2021
18 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the ERA-2 Funds. All monies received hereby
19 shall be deposited in this fund upon receipt, in accordance with federal law and regulations, and
20 shall be appropriated, to the extent funds are received, in accordance with the provisions of this

1 ordinance, in accordance with **Exhibit 1**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by
2 reference.

3 **SECTION THREE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty Six Million Three Hundred
4 Eighty Six Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$26,386,370) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local
5 Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Department of Human Services . The Director of the Department of
6 Human Services is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or
7 other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, and to expend such funds, on behalf
8 of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to
9 issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures, authorized in this Section.
10 The total amount of Rescue Funds for which the Comptroller may issue warrants shall not
11 exceed the total appropriation of Rescue Funds herein.

12 **SECTION FOUR.** There are hereby appropriated Twelve Million Four Hundred Forty-
13 One Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Eight and 20/100th Dollars (\$12,441,998.20) of the ERA-2
14 Funds (to the extent received) to the Department of Human Services. The Director of the
15 Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all
16 contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, and to expend such
17 funds (to the extent received) on behalf of the City for the purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The
18 Director of the Department of Human Services is authorized to execute on behalf of the City an
19 intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the SLHA Cooperation Agreement) with the St. Louis
20 Housing Authority (SLHA) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to the total sum of ERA-
21 2 Funds to SLHA for disbursement to eligible recipients and which shall require SLHA to:

1 provide and support the online portal for intake of applications by City residents for rental and
2 utility assistance funds; provide technical assistance to the City, City contractors/subrecipients,
3 and applicants in the use of the online application portal and the distribution of funds; monitor
4 financial transactions originated through the portal; provide quarterly reporting to the City on
5 applications submitted, applications approved, and disbursements made; and comply with
6 recordkeeping and other requirements for 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and
7 ERA-2 Funds, as applicable, and all applicable City, State, and Federal Laws and regulations.
8 The SLHA Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other terms and conditions as are
9 approved by the City Counselor and shall require approval of the Board of Commissioners of the
10 SLHA prior to execution. The Executive Director of the Community Development
11 Administration or his or her designee is authorized to execute on behalf of the city an
12 intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the BiState Cooperation Agreement) with the BiState
13 Development Corporation (BiState) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to two hundred
14 fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to BiState to provide free transit passes (MetroBus and
15 MetroLink) to city youth between 13 and 25 years old. The BiState Cooperation Agreement shall
16 require BiState to comply with all applicable City, State, and Federal laws and regulations,
17 including the recordkeeping and reporting requirements of the Coronavirus Local Fiscal
18 Recovery Assistance Fund program. Funding for the BiState Cooperation Agreement shall
19 contain such other terms and conditions as are approved by the City Counselor, and shall require
20 approval of the Board of Commissioners of BiState prior to execution. The Comptroller is
21 authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures

1 and transfers authorized in the Section, to the extent funds are received, provided that such
2 warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

3 **SECTION FIVE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Five Million Six Hundred
4 Thousand Dollars (\$5,600,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the
5 Affordable Housing Commission. The Executive Director of the Affordable Housing
6 Commission or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and
7 all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, on behalf of the City
8 for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
9 upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section. The total
10 amount of Rescue Funds for which the Comptroller may issue warrants shall not exceed the total
11 appropriation of Rescue Funds herein.

12 **SECTION SIX.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Sixty Two Million Five
13 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$62,100,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal
14 Recovery Funds to the St. Louis Development Corporation. The Executive Director of the St.
15 Louis Development Corporation or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate,
16 and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds
17 and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. This
18 funding includes funds to build wealth and community along four areas comprising 8.5 miles of
19 historically underserved North St. Louis Commercial Corridors, by providing grants to stabilize
20 small businesses and economic development non-profits, as well as grants to cover a percentage
21 of costs for economic empowerment projects, when paired with funds by the applicant

1 entrepreneur. There are hereby established the following four North St. Louis Commercial
2 Corridors. The Martin Luther King Drive Commercial Corridor will consist of Dr. Martin Luther
3 King Drive bounded by the City Limit of the City of Wellston, Missouri and Jefferson Avenue.
4 The Grand Boulevard Commercial Corridor will consist of Grand Boulevard as bounded by
5 Cottage Avenue and Hebert Avenue. The West Florissant Commercial Corridor which will
6 consist of West Florissant Avenue bounded by Acme to Union Boulevard. The Natural Bridge
7 Commercial Corridor will consist of Natural Bridge Avenue bounded by Kingshighway to
8 Vandeventer. Small business owners, property owners, landlords, and nonprofits can apply for a
9 grant from these funds to cover 30 percent (for new construction) or 50 percent (for rehab) of
10 total costs for a economic empowerment project within one of the Northside Commercial
11 corridors. Applicants must be able to pair the funds provided by the city with their own funds,
12 whether raised from debt or equity, and fulfill three conditions. First, the project must be located
13 within one of the four defined North St. Louis Commercial Corridors as described in this
14 ordinance. Second, the project must be a building improvement or development. Third, the
15 project must enhance retail or cultural offerings in the community. An Advisory Committee will
16 be appointed for each North St. Louis Commercial Corridor. Advisory Committee members must
17 live within one mile of the North St. Louis Commercial Corridor's committee that they would
18 serve on. Advisory Committee members will be selected by the Alderperson or Alderpersons
19 whose ward(s) contain the Commercial Corridor. Advisory Committees can be up to twelve
20 members, with at least two members selected by each Alderman that contains a section of that
21 Commercial

1 Corridor as defined in this ordinance. The St. Louis Development Corporation (SLDC) will
2 manage the program and fund. Administration of and compliance to the program may be paid for
3 with money within the fund. SLDC will conduct initial vetting of the applications for financial
4 and project feasibility, manages all required program documentation, and works directly with
5 grantees to move their projects ahead. These functions may be outsourced by SLDC with
6 approval by the Board of Aldermen through a Resolution. Projects with total costs below
7 \$175,000 will be reviewed by SLDC and the Advisory Committee of the subject Commercial
8 Corridor. Advisory Committee members must live within one mile of a North St. Louis
9 Commercial Corridor. Projects above \$175,000 will be reviewed by SLDC and will require
10 individual approval by the Board of Aldermen. and require individual approval from the city
11 council. Application for grants will be reviewed based on Project Readiness, Catalytic Impact,
12 and recommendation of the Advisory Committee. Assessment of Project Readiness will be based
13 on factors such as Site Control, Property Status including any encumbrances, Project Budget and
14 other financing, Construction plan readiness. Assessment of Catalytic Impact will be bases on
15 community input and whether the intended use fills a gap or need in the neighborhood or will
16 draw people to the community. Recommendation from the Commercial Corridor’s Advisory
17 Committee will be considered in making any final decisions. If an entrepreneur applicant lives
18 within two miles of the Northside Commercial Corridor, he or she will be eligible for an
19 additional fifteen percent of total project costs in grant funding during the development phase of
20 the project. If an entrepreneur applicant does not live within two miles of the Northside
21 Commercial Corridor and hires at least two individuals that do live within two miles of the

1 Northside Commercial Corridor their business is located in, he or she will be eligible for one
2 year of salary reimbursement for those individuals up to 15% of the total project costs. Once a
3 grant is awarded, SLDC will work with the entrepreneurs to help them draw resources from the
4 grant, secure outstanding resources and finances, obtain building permits and any necessary city
5 licenses. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for
6 payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed
7 the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section

8 **SECTION SEVEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Eighteen Million Five
9 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$18,500,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the
10 Community Development Administration. The Director of the Community Development
11 Administration or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any
12 and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend
13 such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes allowed under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal
14 Recovery Fund and as described in **Exhibit 1**. The Executive Director of the of the Community
15 Development Administration or his or her designee is authorized to execute on behalf of the City
16 one intergovernmental cooperation agreements (the SLMHB Cooperation Agreements) with the
17 St. Louis Mental Health Board (SLMHB) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to Two
18 Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) to SLMHB to support providers of early childhood as shown in
19 **Exhibit 1**. The SLMHB Cooperation Agreements shall require SLMHB to comply with
20 recordkeeping and other requirements of the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Assistance
21 Fund program and all applicable City, State, and Federal laws and regulations; and acknowledge

1 and agree that funding for the SLMHB Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other terms
2 and conditions as are approve by the City Counselor and shall require approval of the Board of
3 Trustees of the SLMHB prior to execution. The Executive Director of the Community
4 Development Administration or his or her designee is authorized to execute on behalf of the City
5 an intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the SLPL Cooperation Agreement) with the City
6 of St. Louis Municipal Library District (SLPL) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to
7 Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) to SLPL for digital literacy education and
8 community outreach programs as shown on **Exhibit 1**. The SIP Cooperation Agreement shall
9 require SLPL to comply with recordkeeping and other requirements of the Coronavirus Local
10 Fiscal Recovery Assistance Fund program and all applicable City, State, and Federal laws and
11 regulations; and acknowledge and agree that funding for the SLPL Cooperation Agreement is
12 limited to these appropriated funds. The SLPL Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other
13 terms and conditions as are approved by the City Counselor and shall require approval of the
14 Board of Directors of SLPL, prior to execution by the City. The Comptroller is authorized and
15 directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in
16 this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by
17 this Section. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
18 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
19 exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

20 **SECTION EIGHT.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Fifteen Million Seven
21 Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$15,750,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal

1 Recovery Funds to the Department of Health. The Director of the Department of Health or his or
2 her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other
3 documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the
4 City for purposes allowed under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, as described in
5 **Exhibit 1** including the use of One Million Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars
6 (\$1,250,000) for the purchase of prepaid debit gift cards with a value of up to \$100 each to be
7 used as incentives as part of a Covid-19 Vaccination Incentive Program. The Director of the
8 Department of Health or his or her designee is authorized to execute on behalf of the city an
9 intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the SLMHB Cooperation Agreement) with the St.
10 Louis Mental Health Board (SLMHB) pursuant to which the City shall transfer up to one million
11 dollars (\$1,000,000) to SLMHB to support and empower young people to organize over one
12 hundred events, including safe spaces and community improvement projects. The SLMHB
13 Cooperation Agreement shall require SLMHB to comply with all applicable City, State, and
14 Federal laws and regulations, including the recordkeeping and reporting requirements of the
15 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Assistance Fund program. Funding for the SLMHB
16 Cooperation Agreement shall contain such other terms and conditions as are approved by the
17 City Counselor, and shall require approval of the Board of Trustees of the SLMHB prior to
18 execution. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
19 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
20 exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

1 **SECTION NINE.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of One Million Seven Hundred
2 Fourteen Thousand and One Hundred Dollars (\$1,714,100.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local
3 Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry. The Director of the
4 Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry or his or her designee is hereby authorized to
5 make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to
6 expend such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes described in
7 **Exhibit 1.** The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
8 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
9 exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

10 **SECTION TEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Five Million Three Hundred
11 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$5,350,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the
12 Department of St. Louis Agency on Training and Employment. The Director of the St. Louis
13 Agency on Training and Employment or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make,
14 negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend
15 such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1.**
16 The Director of the Department of St. Louis Agency on Training and Employment is authorized
17 to execute on behalf of the city an intergovernmental cooperation agreement (the SLPS
18 Cooperation Agreement) with the St. Louis Public Schools (SLPS) pursuant to which the City
19 shall transfer up to the total sum of \$1,637,783.92 to SLPS for the establishment of an year round
20 youth jobs program which serves 1000 students, includes financial empowerment, social work
21 and mental health counseling services, and covers ancillary clothing and transit costs. SLPS shall

1 provide quarterly reporting to the City on expenditures and key performance indicators, and
2 comply with recordkeeping and other requirements for 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery
3 Funds, and all applicable City, State, and Federal Laws and regulations. The SLPS Cooperation
4 Agreement shall contain such other terms and conditions as are approved by the City Counselor
5 and shall require approval of the Board of Education of the SLPS prior to execution.” The
6 Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of
7 all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total
8 amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

9 **SECTION ELEVEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Seven Hundred Sixty-
10 Two Thousand and Fifty Dollars (\$762,050) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery
11 Fund to the Information Technology Services Agency. The Director of ITSA or his or her
12 designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other
13 documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds, on behalf of the
14 City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue
15 warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section
16 provided that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

17 **SECTION TWELVE.** There are hereby appropriated Five Million Dollars
18 (\$5,000,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Board of Elections
19 for the City of St. Louis. The Board of Elections or their designee is hereby authorized to make,
20 negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City of St. Louis
21 Board of Elections for the purposes of updating Election Hardware, Software, IT infrastructure

1 to support and implement “Anywhere Voting” systems in the City of St. Louis, as provided in
2 **Exhibit 1.** The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury
3 for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not
4 exceed the total amount of the funds appropriated in this Section.

5 **SECTION THIRTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of One Million Dollars
6 (\$1,000,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the Planning and Urban
7 Design Agency. The Director of the Planning and Urban Design Agency or his or her designee is
8 hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on
9 behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for
10 purposes described in **Exhibit 1.** The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
11 upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that
12 such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section

13 **SECTION FOURTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated Five Million Dollars
14 (\$5,000,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Department of
15 Human Services. The Director of the Department of Human Services shall be responsible for
16 approving the eligibility requirements for the targeted cash assistance program and partnering
17 with local universities in order to evaluate the impact of the program. The Director of the
18 Department of Human Services or her designee are hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and
19 execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City described in Exhibit 2
20 related to evaluation and oversight. The Treasurer shall be responsible for implementing the
21 program and disbursing payments according to the process set out in **Exhibit 2.** Under the

1 Administrative Oversight of the Director of the Department of Human Services, the Treasurer or
2 her designee are hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other
3 documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds, and to expend such funds on behalf of the
4 City as approved by the Department of Human Services for the purposes described on **Exhibit 2**
5 and in accordance with the procedure described in **Exhibit 2**. The Comptroller is authorized and
6 directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in
7 this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by
8 this Section.

9 **SECTION FIFTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Two Million Five
10 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to
11 the Board of Public Service. The President of the Board of Public Service or his or her designee
12 is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on
13 behalf of the City to expend such funds and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for
14 purposes described in **Exhibit 1**. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
15 upon the City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that
16 such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

17 **SECTION SIXTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Five Hundred and Fifty
18 Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund to the Office
19 of the Comptroller. The Comptroller or his or her designee is hereby authorized to make,
20 negotiate, and execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend
21 such funds and to expend such funds on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1**.

1 The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment
2 of all expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total
3 amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

4 **SECTION SEVENTEEN.** There are hereby appropriated the sum of Three Hundred
5 Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars (\$312,500) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery
6 Fund to The Office of the Mayor. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and
7 execute any and all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend such funds and
8 to expend such funds on behalf of the City for purposes described in **Exhibit 1.** The Comptroller
9 is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the City Treasury for payment of all
10 expenditures authorized in this Section provided that such warrants do not exceed the total
11 amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

12 **SECTION EIGHTEEN.** In order to ensure the efficiency, effectiveness, equity, and
13 transparency of the use of taxpayer funds and relief programs to address the coronavirus
14 pandemic, on or before the 10th of each month after this bill passes, and ending in April 2023,
15 the Mayor’s office shall present to the Board of Aldermen’s Housing, Urban Development and
16 Zoning Committee and provide a written report regarding planned expenditures and detailing
17 expenditures made to date. The plan should detail how data will help make inform decisions and
18 are in line with health equity principles addressing COVID 19, including but not limited to:
19 collecting, analyzing, and reporting data disaggregated by age, race, ethnicity, gender, disability,
20 neighborhood, and other sociodemographic characteristics; including the people most affected
21 by health and economic challenges in the decision making process; promoting racial equity in

1 response and recovery efforts; and strengthening public health, health care, and social
2 infrastructure that foster resilience. Reports should update plans and procedures for redirecting
3 and targeting resources based on emerging data trends that identify disparities. The report shall
4 also be posted on the City’s website.

5 **SECTION NINETEEN.** In the event the City of St. Louis uses federal funds to expand
6 or create Intentional Encampments as outlined in **Exhibit 1** of this ordinance, no such use shall
7 occur in the areas or any portion thereof that lies within the following boundaries of the

3 **SECTION TWENTY.** Conflicts of Interest. To ensure the selection of providers based on

6 Agreement established by the Board of Public Service, and 2 CFR 200, the Uniform

9 conflict of interest form subject to verification by the Comptroller. Any marketing materials

12 **SECTION TWENTY ONE.** Severability Clause. It is hereby declared to be the intention of

1 **SECTION TWENTY TWO.** Emergency Clause. Delay in receipt and appropriation of
2 these monies will increase threats to the public health and welfare by causing delay in
3 responding to the COVID-19 crisis. This being an ordinance appropriated for emergency funding
4 for current expenses of the City government, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure
5 within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis
6 and shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

7 **SECTION TWENTY THREE.** There are hereby appropriated Five Million Dollars
8 (\$5,000,000.00) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the Police Department
9 for the purpose of Police Department
10 Overtime (Account 6505172).

11 **SECTION TWENTY FOUR.** There are hereby appropriated Three Hundred Seventy
12 Thousand Dollars (\$370,000) of the 2021 Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to the
13 Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. The chair of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council
14 of his or her designee is hereby authorized to make, negotiate, and execute any and all contracts
15 or other documents to expend such funds on behalf of Criminal Justice Coordinating Council for
16 the purposes described in Exhibit 1. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants
17 upon the City Treasury for payment for all expenditures authorized in this Section provided
18 that such warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this Section.

EXHIBIT 2

Direct Cash Assistance for the American Rescue Plan Act Funds

Section I: Purpose

A. Direct Cash Assistance (DCA) is to be used to provide funds to St. Louis City residents who have had a negative financial impact due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and do not exceed 80% of Area Median Income (AMI).

Sections II: Total Disbursement & Anticipated Impact

- A. The St. Louis Treasurer's Office will oversee the equitable and efficient disbursement of \$5,000,000 of ARPA funds to St. Louis City residents. Disbursements will be made in the amount of \$500 serving about 10,000 residents.
- B. Funds will be targeted for St. Louis City residents who do not exceed 80% of the AMI as shown in **Table A**, and who meet the eligibility requirements set out in Section IV
- C. No more than 7 percent of the total funds can be used for administrative costs such as application processing.

Section III: Application Process

- A. Individuals must complete an online or paper application to submit personal and demographic information. Applicants will also have to provide proof of identity, income, dependent/dependency status, household size, household income, residency within the City of St. Louis, and proof of economic hardship. The application will outline acceptable forms of proof.
- B. For those without access to technology, a series of application completion events with partners across the City of St. Louis for residents will be held to assist residents in completing applications. The first application event will be held in one of the city's Qualified Census Tracts and will occur within two weeks of passage of this ordinance. For the first thirty days that the funds are available, at least fifteen percent of the total funds will be reserved for applicants that applied at an application event.
- C. Applicants will be notified by mail, by phone and/or by text message of approval and receive a unique pick-up ID and pickup location as outlined in Section VI
- D. Applicants will also be connected with resources from the St. Louis Office of Financial Empowerment

Section IV: Eligibility Requirements

- A. Resident of the City of St. Louis for a minimum of 12 months.
- B. At least 18 years of age (or have been able to be claimed) as a dependent for tax year 2020.
- C. Priority shall be given to Head of Households in Qualified Census Tracts with dependents
- D.. Proof of economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic including, but not limited to:
1. Job loss (laid off, furloughed, reduced hours)

2. Unpaid time off due to quarantining or lingering effects of COVID-19
3. Inability to work due to lack and/or loss of childcare
4. Increase in childcare expenses
5. Funeral expenses due to COVID-19 related death
6. Unplanned out-of-pocket medical expenses due to COVID-19 complications
7. Reduction in stimulus payment due to child support

Section V: Special Circumstances

A. Undocumented St. Louisans:

1. The undocumented population in the City of St. Louis will be eligible to receive direct assistance. We understand that this population may not feel comfortable disclosing information or interacting with governmental entities, and thus we will distribute funds through partners who have a 501(c)3 status and regularly work with these populations.

Special guidelines for undocumented residents are as follows:

- i. Eligibility requirements will be the same as outlined in **Section IV** and

Table A.

- ii. Applications will be completed through the 501(C)3 partner and for those who are granted a disbursement, data on satisfaction of eligibility requirements will be sent to the STLTO with unique alphanumeric IDs (instead of names) to protect the confidentiality of the applicants

B. Unhoused Residents

1. The homeless population in the City of St. Louis will be eligible to receive direct assistance. Special guidelines for unhoused residents are as follows:
 - i. Proof of homeless status which we will determine in alignments with those provided by state. (See: <https://health.mo.gov/seniors/resources/pdf/housing-eligibility-dmh.pdf>)
 - ii. Proof of economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic as outlined in **Section IV**.
 - iii. Entity sponsor through homeless assistance and/or outreach organization/program (shelter, center, church, etc.) along with cooperation from the Dept. of Human Services/Homeless Services Division (HSD) for the City of St. Louis.

Section VI: Disbursement Plan

A. Debit Card

- All disbursements will be placed on a secure, fee free, pin-protected debit card for St. Louis residents.
- Residents will be able to pick up cards from up to seven (7) accessible partner locations across the St. Louis metro area. Confirmations will be communicated once applications are approved
- Residents shall present their ID at one of the seven (7) pickup locations to receive their card.
 - Residents will be provided with financial empowerment materials prior to the disbursement of funds, and invited to participate in a financial empowerment course.
 - Program may shall allow for direct deposit options.
