

Summary
Board Bill Number 126

This Board Bill is recommended by the Planning Commission. It approves the renaming of the entire length of a public street in the City of St. Louis, Childrens Place -- extending between Euclid Avenue on the west to Taylor Avenue on the east to be renamed to Nash Way to celebrate the accomplishments and cultural impact of Dr. Helen Nash on the Saint Louis region.

1 An ordinance recommended by the Planning Commission approving the renaming of the
2 entire length of a public street in the City of St. Louis, Childrens Place -- extending between
3 Euclid Avenue on the west to Taylor Avenue on the east to be renamed to Nash Way to celebrate
4 the accomplishments and cultural impact of Dr. Helen Nash on the Saint Louis region.

5 **Whereas**, Ordinance 60797, approved April 11, 1988, established procedures for the
6 naming and renaming of public streets in the City of St. Louis, and such procedures have been
7 codified as Chapter 20.12 of the Revised Code of the City of St. Louis by Ordinance 68604,
8 approved March 16, 2010;

9 **Whereas**, the Postmaster reviewed the request and had no concerns of the renaming of
10 Childrens Place to Nash Way between Euclid Ave. and Taylor Ave.; and

11 **Whereas**, the Board of Public Service reviewed and recommended approval of the
12 renaming of Childrens Place to Nash Way between Euclid Ave. and Taylor Ave.; and

13 **Whereas**, the Planning Commission recommended approval of the renaming of
14 Childrens Place to Nash Way between Euclid Ave. and Taylor Ave. at its meeting on October 6,
15 2021; and

16 **Whereas**, the Board of Aldermen finds that the procedures and approvals required by
17 said Chapter of the City Code have been followed and obtained with respect to such renaming of
18 the existing public street.

1 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

2 **SECTION ONE.** Childrens Place, an existing public street, extends approximately 0.17
3 miles between Euclid Avenue on the west to Taylor Avenue on the east. The location of
4 Childrens Place, as well as the parcels located along the street, is shown on the attached general
5 location map. (See **Exhibit A**)

6 A petition to rename the street was submitted to the Planning and Urban Design Agency
7 by Washington University In St. Louis, the property owners of five (5) of the five (5) parcels
8 which front on Childrens Place, and the alderwoman within whose wards the street is located.
9 The Planning Commission reviewed the renaming of the street at its meeting on October 6, 2021.
10 At that meeting, the Planning Commission found that the proposed street name meets the criteria
11 for street names and recommended approval of the petition as submitted to the Board of
12 Aldermen.

13 The Board of Aldermen finds that the procedures and approvals required by said Chapter
14 of the City Code have been followed and obtained with respect to such renaming of the existing
15 public street, and that the entire length of the street shall be renamed from Childrens Place to
16 Nash Way.

17 **SECTION TWO.** Pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance 68604, the public street
18 Childrens Place shall hereafter be renamed to Nash Way. The Director of Streets is hereby
19 directed to change the street signs designating the aforesaid street from Childrens Place to Nash
20 Way.
