HONORING “MISS MISSOURI” JOYE FORREST**

WHEREAS, we pause today in our deliberations to recognize and congratulate Joye Forrest winner of the Miss Missouri Pageant in May 2021; we wish her luck as she represents Missouri in the upcoming Miss USA Pageant; and

WHEREAS, Joye Forrest was born in St. Louis, Missouri on November 29th, 1995, to Jeffrey and Sheila Forrest; Joye is the proud granddaughter of Russ Little, Sr., Founder of Afro World Hair and Fashion Company; and

WHEREAS, Joye loves to perform and has been dancing since the age of three; she followed her dream, receiving the Sharon Disney Land scholarship, named for Walt Disney’s daughter, and graduated with honors, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree from the California Institute of the Arts, a top tier arts school; and

WHEREAS, Joye Forrest has traveled to nine countries teaching dance and experiencing the world; in Ghana she served an African orphan, she appeared in commercials, including her recent commercial directed by Solange Knowles; Joye has been featured in countless music videos and also danced professionally as a Laker Girl for the Los Angeles Lakers; and

WHEREAS, currently, Joye Forrest is teaching Dance, Rhythmic Gymnastics, and Cheer while studying for her Doctorate in Chiropractic treatment; she is the brand ambassador for The Salvation Army, COCA (Center for Creative Arts), Afro World and Warriors of Ross; and
