

**RESOLUTION 182
JAMECA STANFIELD**

WHEREAS, we pause today in our deliberations to remember Jameca Stanfield a devoted mother, daughter, and sister with a warm, sensitive, and generous heart; and

WHEREAS, Jameca was an avid professional; she worked as a Customer Service Supervisor at Aesculap for over 10 years and received the All-Star award in both 2012 and 2015; this award recognizes an employee who exhibits a positive work attitude, has a high work ethic and embodies the Aesculap culture; and

WHEREAS, Jameca was serious about family bonding and always made time for others; she enjoyed traveling, reading, shopping, and watching sports, but it was celebrating life's special moments with family and friends that meant the most to her; and

WHEREAS, on April 12, 2016, at age 39, Jameca was struck and killed by a vehicle traveling between 80-90 mph while she was crossing the street at a crosswalk going to her car; the driver left the scene; and

WHEREAS, her family and friends were devastated by this tragedy and the loss of their beloved Jameca; her sister, Tiffanie, went to work almost immediately to establish Fighting H.A.R.D. (Fighting Against Hit And Run Driving), a 501c3 organization established to raise awareness, educate, and provide resources for families impacted by hit and run fatalities; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis that we pause in our deliberations to remember Jameca Stanfield; to encourage and thank her sister, Tiffanie, for her efforts to support other families and raise awareness about hit and run fatalities throughout St. Louis. We further direct the Clerk of this Board to spread a copy of this Resolution across the minutes of these proceedings and to prepare a commemorative copy to the end that it may be presented to the family of our honoree at a time and place deemed appropriate by the Sponsor.
