He had high hopes that one day, one of his grandchildren would become a basketball star; and

WHEREAS, Earl loved his family dearly. He was a proud father and grandfather who loved to hear his grandchildren call him, "Pa Pa;" and

WHEREAS, in December of 2012, Earl's friend, Sonny, introduced him to Anita. Shortly after the two had a blind date, they met at Harold's home, the brother of Earl. In that moment, Earl knew he had found the love of his life. On February 15, 2015, Earl and Anita were united in Holy Matrimony; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2017, Earl was involved in a serious automobile accident. While still recovering from his injuries, Earl succumbed to death on Sunday, March 18, 2018, with his loving wife, Anita, and family at his side; and
