

**RESOLUTION NUMBER 105**  
**Patricia “Pat” Manley**

**WHEREAS**, we have been apprised that longtime St. Louis City employee, Patricia “Pat” Manley will soon be retiring; and

**WHEREAS**, Ms. Manley graduated from DuBourg High School in June 1970; and

**WHEREAS**, she started with the Department of Public Safety, Building Division on August 23, 1970, as a clerk-typist for the “Special Demolition Section.” She became one of the first women building inspectors in April 1976; and

**WHEREAS**, Ms Manley worked as a building inspector in both the Soulard and Lafayette Square neighborhoods in the 1980's and contributed to the revitalization of both neighborhoods during her tenure; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1989 Pat was promoted to the position of Building Inspector Supervisor and played a role in the implementation of the Housing Conservation District ordinance. Serving on a committee with the Board of Aldermen, she helped develop an inspection manual that now serves as a model for other municipalities; and

**WHEREAS**, she worked at the temporary field office during the flood of 1993. She was responsible for coordinating inspection crews and utility companies who checked every building in the flood area; and

**WHEREAS**, on the day of her retirement, September 1, 2009, she will have worked for the building division for over of 39 years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis, being apprised of the significant contributions of Patricia “Pat” Manley to the City of St. Louis, we pause in our deliberations to consider and adopt this resolution and instruct the Clerk of this Board to spread a copy of this Resolution over the permanent rolls of the Board and to further prepare a memorial copy of this Resolution so that it may be presented to our honoree as deemed appropriate by the Sponsor.
