## CITY ELECTION BOARD TO OFFER OFF-SITE ABSENTEE VOTING

(St. Louis, MO) – The Board of Election Commissioners for the City of St. Louis (the “BEC”) will offer off-site absentee voting at two locations starting on Tuesday, March 30, 2021, and continuing until Monday, April 5, the day before the General Municipal Election on April 6. Absentee voting will be available for those individuals who meet the qualification requirements set forth in RSMO Sec. 115.277.1 from 10:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M. on March 30, March 31, April 1, April 2, and April 5. There is no off-site voting on Saturday, April 3, or Sunday, April 4.

The two locations are:

1. Better Family Life – 5415 Page Blvd.
2. Immaculate Heart of Mary Church – 4092 Blow Street.

Voters who want to vote an absentee ballot at these locations will only be able to vote on a touch screen machine. Voters who want to cast a paper ballot will have to do so at the BEC’s office at 300 N. Tucker Blvd.

**UNLIKE LAST AUGUST AND NOVEMBER, A VOTER WILL NOT BE ABLE TO REQUEST AN ABSENTEE BALLOT DUE TO BEING “AT RISK” OF CONTRACTING COVID-19, NOR WILL THEY BE ABLE TO REQUEST A “MAIL-IN” BALLOT FOR THIS ELECTION. HOWEVER, A VOTER CAN REQUEST AND CAST AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IF ONE OF THE SIX PRE-COVID STATUTORY REASONS APPLIES.** A regular absentee ballot application form, along with information regarding absentee voting and a sample ballot, are available on the BEC’s website at [www.stelections.com](http://www.stelections.com).

Absentee voting began on Monday, March 15, at the BEC’s office and will continue at the BEC’s office from 8:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, as well as on Saturday, April 3, from 9:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M. The last day that a voter can request an absentee ballot by mail is Wednesday, March 24. The last day that a voter can vote an absentee ballot in person is Monday, April 5.
