INTRODUCTION

Background

Contract Name: North Newstead

Contract Number: 12-31-54

Contract Period: January 1, 2012 through October 31, 2012

CFDA Number: 14.218

Contract Amount: \$168,119

This contract provided Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to North Newstead (Agency) to combat physical deterioration in the Penrose and O'Fallon neighborhoods.

Purpose

The purpose of the review was to determine the Agency's compliance with federal, state and local Community Development Administration (CDA) requirements for the period January 1, 2012 through October 31, 2012, and make recommendations for improvements as considered necessary.

Scope and Methodology

Inquiries were made regarding the Agency's internal controls relating to the grant administered by the Community Development Administration (CDA). Evidence was tested supporting the reports the Agency submitted to CDA and other procedures were performed as considered necessary. Fieldwork was completed on May 8, 2013.

Exit Conference

An exit conference was offered to the Agency on June 21, 2013, but the agency declined.

SUMMARY OF OBSERVATIONS

Conclusion

No evidence was found to suggest that the Agency did not fully comply with federal, state and local CDA requirements.

Status of Prior Observations

The Agency's previous fiscal monitoring report, Project #2011-CDA29, issued August 4, 2011, contained no observations.

A-133 Status

According to a letter received from the Agency dated September 12, 2012, it did not expend \$500,000 or more in federal funds during its last calendar year ended December 31, 2011; therefore, the Agency was not required to have an A-133 audit.

Summary of Current Observations

There were no current observations.
