SHOW ME HEALTHY WOMEN



- Collaborated with Washington University Doctoral students to design and implement qualitative studies involving treatment delays in the African American community. Listed as 3rd author on the article "Addressing racial disparities in breast cancer treatment delays: an application of group model building". The article abstract was submitted to be presented at the American Public Health Association annual meeting in October 2016.



SHOW ME HEALTHY WOMEN



- Provided 3,200 breast and cervical cancer screenings.
- Community outreach at the "Sista Strut walk", African American Cancer conference, and the African American Nursing History Conference.
- Continued relationship with the Regional Breast Navigators.



MATERNAL CHILD HEALTH



- Developed a promising practice policy and protocol for community partners to use in their facilities upon request.
- Maternal Child Health instructional material and guidelines have been identified as a best practice by the State of Missouri.
- Two employees obtained safety seat technician certification.
- 201 cribs were disseminated to the community.



MATERNAL CHILD HEALTH



- Identified alternative safe sleep class sites at local car dealerships, and faith based community partners.
- 7 safe sleep classes - 112 participants.
- Collaborated with Better Family Life to provide education and follow up on eight families referred due to having Maternal Child Health concerns.



HEALTH EQUITY



- 10 asthma education classes - 246 adults.
- 8 lead education classes - 142 children, 50 adults.
- Collaborated with Washington University's George Warren Brown School of Social Work to develop projects centered around building regional capacity to better serve African American male adults/youth in St. Louis City and County.
- 93 males participated in men's health classes.



SCHOOL HEALTH



- 803 lead test/education classes.
- 168 nurse consults provided to community partners.
- 6,929 school/daycare/preschool audits.
- one team member obtain certification in Phlebotomy.
