**Emergency Shelter Programs**

Essential Services: fulfilling basic human needs; no requirements for entry; accessible (physical location in the region and for all physical abilities); length of stay should be determined by specific and individualized housing strategy.

Not "program" heavy.

**Transitional Housing Programs**

Essential Services: fulfilling basic human needs; medium barrier to entering permanent housing i.e. pregnant, early recovery, strong employment history with only temporary unemployment, sexual orientation transition, recovering from surgery; etc.

Clients should be able to move on quickly, despite 24 month standard definition.

**Permanent Supportive Housing Programs**

Essential Services: fulfilling basic human needs; high barrier to entering permanent housing i.e. persistent mental health and/or substance use disorder; legal challenges; etc.

Clients should be able to “move on” in to more independent permanent housing such as section 8 within 5 years. Programming and treatment plan should be targeting that outcome.
