CJCC Budget Overview

In 2019, the City's Board of Aldermen and Alderwomen passed Ordinance 71012 which authorized the CJCC to be created as an independent body corporate and politic under Missouri law. The Ordinance authorized the CJCC to establish a budget as an independent body through the City, apply for, receive, and expend grant funds, to contract, to make recommendations and to define and analyze issues, among its stated authority. The City of St. Louis shall, subject to appropriation, provide all necessary supplies, equipment, and resources to the CJCC to assist in the performance of its functions.
