A note about the STL Monarch Mix: these plants have been carefully selected to present the best-suited collection to support the monarch butterfly population. We recommend including as many milkweed plants and species as possible, as they are the most important for monarch breeding. If you are unable to find all of the plants in the STL Monarch Mix, use additional milkweed and nectar plants as needed. The use of locally-appropriate native plants and materials without chemical fertilizers or herbicides is strongly encouraged.
