The Cultural Resources Office is conducting an extensive inventory of the City's modern architecture built between 1945 and 1975 with Peter Meijer Architect, PC as the consultant for the project.

The February 11th meeting seeks public participation in an important decision. A group of 40 buildings has been selected for review at this meeting prior to deciding on a final group of properties to be further documented and we want your input. These buildings will be presented at the meeting and considered in terms of how they defined the era of 1945-1975 in St. Louis. The meeting will include a progress report on the project and Modern Architecture expert Christine Madrid French will provide comments on signature St. Louis architecture.
