Board Members Vaccaro, Bosley, Arnowitz and President Reed introduced by request:

Board Bill No. 175

WHEREAS, Dearies and Marie relocated to St. Louis in 1932 and Mr. McClure attended Dunbar Elementary School and then Washington Tech High School; and

WHEREAS, following high school at the age of 17, Mr. McClure joined the US Army in 1948 and was in the military until he was discharged in 1953. Mr. McClure spent a couple years at the U.S. Armed Forces Institute in Fort Lewis, Washington, and became an expert rifleman.
