

**ORDINANCE #65767**  
**Board Bill No. 332**

An ordinance pertaining to parking; repealing Section Two of Ordinances 65306 and enacting in lieu thereof a new section prohibiting the parking of vehicles, except for such vehicles owned or operated by individuals designated by the Presiding Judge of the Twenty-Second Judicial Circuit, on the east side of Tucker Boulevard, the south side of Market Street, the west side of 11<sup>th</sup> Street and the north side of Walnut Street as such streets are appurtenant to City Block 206 North; containing exceptions and an emergency clause.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION ONE.** Section Two of Ordinance 65306, approved on May 24, 1995 is hereby repealed. In lieu thereof the following section is enacted:

Section Two. No person, firm, or corporation shall park any vehicle, except for such vehicles owned or operated by individuals designated by the Presiding Judge of the Twenty-Second Judicial Circuit, on the east side of Tucker Boulevard, the south side of Market Street, the west side of 11<sup>th</sup> Street and the north side of Walnut Street as such streets are appurtenant to City Block 206 North. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any vehicle temporarily stopped at a space currently designated as "Disabled Drop-off Only", to any permitted vehicle parked in a space designated for the United States Food and Drug Administration or to that portion of the east side of Tucker Boulevard beginning at the south curblineline of Market Street to a point One Hundred and Eighteen (118) feet south. The Director of Streets is authorized to designate no more than three parking spaces on the west side of 11<sup>th</sup> Street between Walnut Street and Market Street for use by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

**SECTION TWO.** Emergency clause.

This being an ordinance for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor.
