

1 **BOARD BILL. 252**

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN JEFFREY BOYD

2 An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service authorizing the 2018 St. Louis
3 Works and the 50/50 Sidewalk Programs City Wide providing for the construction and
4 reconstruction of gutters, streets, driveways, spot curbs, sidewalks, alleys, traffic controls,
5 beautification, tree planting, resurfacing and related engineering adjustments listed herein,
6 appropriating \$5,300,000.00 from the Street Improvement Fund; containing sections for
7 description of the work, approval of plans and specifications, work and material guarantees,
8 estimated costs from City funds and supplemental agreements and reversion authorizations,
9 applicable state and federal wage rate requirements, equal opportunity provisions, the Mayor's
10 Executive Orders, contract advertising statutes, and a public work emergency clause.

11 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SAINT LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

12 Section One. The Board of Public Service is hereby authorized to let contracts, employ and pay
13 for labor, wages, consultants, equipment, computer programs and hardware, employees,
14 supervision and otherwise provide for designing, constructing, reconstructing, replacing,
15 beautifying, traffic controls, landscaping, paving, resurfacing, and related engineering
16 adjustments to the streets, alleys and public rights-of-way in the twenty-eight wards of the City
17 for the 2018 St. Louis Works and the 50/50 Sidewalk Programs as evidenced by Exhibit "A"
18 attached hereto and on file in the City Register's Office.

19 Section Two. There is hereby appropriated Five Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
20 (\$5,300,000.00) which is the aggregate estimated cost of the City's share of the Public Work
21 authorized herein, from funds set aside and placed to the credit of the Street Improvement Fund

1 established by Ordinance 55852, approved March 31, 1971 and Ordinance 55964, 55965, and
2 55966, approved July 1, 1971 and any other subsequent ordinance, as amended and the
3 Comptroller is authorized to draw warrants, accept gifts, make payments from the general fund
4 and the Street Improvement Funds as they become available throughout the year to pay any
5 portion of the cost of the labor, contracts, materials, equipment, computer programs, and public
6 improvements contained and authorized herein by this St. Louis Works Construction Ordinance.

7 Section Three. The work provided for herein shall be carried out in accordance with detailed
8 plans and specifications and necessary supplemental agreements to be approved by the Board of
9 Public Service before bids are advertised therefore.

10 Section Four. If let by contract said contract, or contracts, shall provide that the contractor, or
11 contractors, doing said work shall guarantee and keep in repair all of the work, equipment and
12 materials used in connection therewith for a term of at least one year, commencing on the date of
13 acceptance of the work by the City.

14 Section Five. All construction contracts let under authority of this ordinance shall provide that no
15 less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages in the City of St. Louis, as determined by the
16 Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of the State of Missouri (Section 290.210 through
17 290.340 RSMo 1995) for each craft or type of work needed in the actual labor on the jobs herein
18 authorized, as well as the general prevailing rate of pay for legal holidays and overtime work
19 shall be paid to all workers. All contracts let in connection with the work provided for herein
20 shall be subject to, and in conformance with, all statutes of the State of Missouri and the Charter
21 and Code of the City of St. Louis.

1 Section Six. Any revenue received by the City from the 50/50 Sidewalk Program, gifts or
2 cooperation agreements shall be deposited to the credit of the individual wards, as established in
3 Ordinance 62206.

4 Section Seven. To allow full participation and to help in the St. Louis Works Program, and to
5 accomplish the overall goals for the improvements in all twenty-eight wards of the City; the
6 Board of Public Service and the Comptroller are authorized to enter into supplemental
7 agreements with various Federal, State, Local, and private entities to provide for funds, work,
8 site dedications, and acquisitions by negotiations and condemnations.

9 Section Eight. All specifications approved by the Board of Public Service and contracts let under
10 authority of this ordinance shall provide for compliance with the Presidential Executive Order
11 11246 and 379 on Equal Opportunity and the Mayor's Executive Order of December 22, 1986 on
12 selection of experts and consultants. The Board of Public Service shall establish goals on all
13 contracts of no less than twenty five (25%) participation by minority subcontractors and material
14 suppliers and no less than five percent (5%) participation by women subcontractors and
15 suppliers. It is the policy of the City of St. Louis to pursue the goal of having thirty percent of
16 apprenticeship positions and twenty-five percent of all other positions involved in construction
17 work in the St. Louis metropolitan area filled by residents of the City of St. Louis of these
18 positions it is intend that one half be filled by members of minority groups and ten percent (10%)
19 by females. The City will make a determination if the contractor has made a good faith effort to
20 achieve these goals.

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1 Section Nine. All sections of this ordinance are and shall be severable. In the event that any
2 section of this ordinance is found to be illegal, the remaining sections of this ordinance shall
3 remain valid and to the benefit of the City.

4 Section Ten. All advertisements for bids pursuant to this Ordinance shall be subject to Section
5 8.250, RSMo 1995.

6 Section Eleven. This being an ordinance to provide for public work and improvements, it is
7 hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall become effective immediately upon its
8 passage and approval by the Mayor.
