

BOARD BILL NO. 60 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN CHARLES Q. TROUPE

1 An Ordinance, recommended by the Board of Public Service of the City of St. Louis (the "Board
2 of Public Service"), establishing a public works and improvement project for the design and
3 construction of the Kingshighway Memorial Boulevard Improvements between Bircher
4 Boulevard and West Florissant Avenue (the "Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement
5 Project"); and authorizing and directing the City of St. Louis (the "City"), by and through its
6 Board of Public Service, to let contracts and provide for the design, construction, materials, and
7 equipment for the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project, authorizing the Board of
8 Public Service to employ labor and consultants, pay salaries, fees and wages, acquire real
9 property interests, and to enter into supplemental agreements with the Missouri Highway and
10 Transportation Commission, Federal Highway Administration, utilities, and other governmental
11 agencies for the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project all in accordance with the
12 federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (23 U.S.C. 110, *et seq.*), with any contract
13 containing sections for: description of the work, material guarantees, estimated expenditure
14 allocations, fund reversion authorization, applicable federal and state wage rate requirements,
15 equal opportunity provisions, the Mayor's Executive Orders, and contract advertising statutes;
16 requiring that all work provided for herein shall be carried out in accordance with detailed plans
17 and specifications adopted and approved by the Board of Public Service before bids are
18 advertised therefor; directing that all construction contracts let by authority of this Ordinance
19 provide for federal and state prevailing wages requirements including prevailing wage holiday
20 and overtime pay and compliance with all applicable statutes of the State of Missouri, the City
21 Charter and the Revised Code of the City, as amended; requiring all specifications approved by
22 the Board of Public Service and contracts let by authority of this Ordinance provide for

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1 compliance with the Mayor's Executive Orders on Equal Opportunity and maximum
2 MBE/WBE/DBE utilization goals, except when superseded or prohibited by federal or state law
3 or regulation; requiring all advertisements for bids pursuant to this Ordinance be subject to the
4 provisions of Section 8.250 RSMo., as amended; and appropriating the total estimated cost of the
5 Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project of One Million, Three Hundred Thousand
6 Dollars (\$1,300,000.00) from various sources including the Federal Highway Administration
7 Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users
8 (SAFETEA-LU), and the One-Half Cent Ward Capital Improvement Fund; authorizing and
9 directing the Comptroller of the City to draw warrants from time to time and disburse funds
10 appropriated by this ordinance and to receive and disburse grant funds in accordance with the
11 Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century (23 U.S.C. 110, et seq.) upon the signature and
12 certification of vouchers by the President of the Board of Public Service; and containing a public
13 work emergency clause.

14 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

15 SECTION ONE. There is hereby authorized a public works and improvement project for the
16 design and construction of the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project between
17 Bircher Boulevard and West Florissant Avenue (the "Kingshighway Memorial Blvd.
18 Improvement Project")

19 SECTION TWO. The City of St. Louis (the "City"), by and through its Board of Public Service
20 (the "Board of Public Service"), is hereby authorized and directed to let contracts and provide for
21 the design, construction, materials, and equipment, for the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd.
22 Improvement Project, to employ labor and consultants, pay salaries, fees and wages, acquire real

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1 property interests for the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project, to enter into
2 supplemental agreements with the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission, Federal
3 Highway Administration, utilities, and other governmental agencies, all in accordance with the
4 federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (23 U.S.C. 110, *et seq.*), with any
5 contracts containing sections for: description of the work, material guarantees, estimated
6 expenditure allocations, fund reversion authorization, applicable federal and state wage rate
7 requirements, equal opportunity provisions, the Mayor's Executive Orders, and contract
8 advertising statutes.

9 SECTION THREE. The work provided for herein shall be carried out in accordance with
10 detailed plans and specifications to be adopted and approved by the Board of Public Service
11 before bids are advertised therefor.

12 SECTION FOUR. All construction contracts let under authority of this Ordinance shall provide
13 that no less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages in the City, as determined in accordance
14 with the Federal Davis-Bacon Act and by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of
15 the State of Missouri (Sections 290.210 through 290.340 RSMo. 2000, as amended,) for each
16 craft or type of work needed in the actual labor on the jobs herein authorized, as well as the
17 general prevailing rate of pay for legal holidays and overtime work shall be paid to all workers
18 on the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project. All contracts let in connection with
19 the construction provided for herein shall be subject to, and in conformance with all applicable
20 statutes of the State of Missouri and the City Charter and Revised Code of the City, as amended.

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1 SECTION FIVE. All specifications approved by the Board of Public Service and contracts let
2 under the authority of this Ordinance shall provide for compliance with the Mayor's Executive
3 Orders on Equal Opportunity and maximum MBE/WBE/DBE utilization goals, except when
4 otherwise superseded or prohibited by federal or state law or regulation.

5 SECTION SIX. All advertisement for bids pursuant to this Ordinance shall be subject to Section
6 8.250 RSMo. 2000, as amended.

7 SECTION SEVEN. The total estimated cost of the Kingshighway Memorial Blvd. Improvement
8 Project is One Million, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,300,000.00) of which the federal
9 share is One Million, Forty Thousand Dollars (\$1,040,000.00) from the Federal Highway
10 Administration Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for
11 Users (SAFETEA-LU) to be appropriated from the Federal Aid to Urban Program Match Share
12 fund, also known as the Federal Aid to Urban Program Revolving Fund, established by
13 Ordinance 56931, and the remaining local match share is Two Hundred and Sixty Thousand
14 Dollars (\$260,000.00) to be appropriated from the One-Half Cent Ward Capital Improvement
15 Fund. Said improvements shall be contracted and executed in parts as funds are accrued in this
16 Match Share Fund and are adequate to pay the City's share of the cost.

17 SECTION EIGHT. The Comptroller of the City is hereby authorized and directed to draw
18 warrants from time to time and disburse funds appropriated by this ordinance and is further
19 authorized and directed to receive and disburse grant funds in accordance with the
20 Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century (23 U.S.C. 110, *et seq.*), upon the signature and
21 certification of vouchers by the President of the Board of Public Service. Reimbursement funds
22 received shall be deposited into the Federal Aid to Urban Program Match Share Fund

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1 Ordinance 56931.

2 SECTION NINE. The Board of Public Service is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the
3 City monetary donations from other governmental agencies and others to assist in paying for the
4 work authorized in this Ordinance. Funds received shall be deposited into the Kingshighway
5 Memorial Blvd. Improvement Project or the Federal Aid to Urban Program Match Share Fund,
6 also known as the Federal Aid to Urban Program Revolving Fund, established by

7 Ordinance 56931.

8 SECTION TEN. This being an ordinance providing for public work and improvement, it is
9 hereby declared to be an emergency measure as defined in Article IV, Sections 19 and 20 of the
10 City Charter and shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the
11 Mayor of the City.
