

St. Louis City Ordinance 63839

FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

BOARD BILL NO. [96] 78

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN PHYLLIS YOUNG , MARIT CLARK

An ordinance pertaining to the use of roller skates, in line skates, skateboards or similar devices; enacting a new ordinance prohibiting the use of roller skates, in line skates, and skateboards in a area as defined herein; containing a penalty clause and emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. The use of roller skates, in line skates, skateboards or similar devices shall be prohibited, by any person, upon any public street, alley, sidewalk, park, plaza, mall or other public area bounding the streets and alleys within the area bounded by Jefferson Avenue on the west, Washington Avenue on the north, Leonor K. Sullivan Boulevard on the east, and Interstate 64 on the south.

SECTION TWO. Section One shall not apply to the following individuals:

1. a participant in a parade or other public event for which a permit has been issued by the City Street Department or the Board of Public Service for said parade or other public event to be conducted within the aforementioned geographical area;
2. an individual who uses roller skates, in line skates, skateboards or similar devices in conducting his or her business or employment, or commuting to a specific destination.
3. an individual who uses roller skates, in line skates, skateboards or similar devices on a designated bicycle path.

SECTION THREE. Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of Section One shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for the first violation and not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), for any subsequent violation occurring within one year of the date of the guilty plea or finding of guilt for the first violation. In lieu of a fine, the Court may require the completion of not less than Fifteen (15) hours of Community Service.

SECTION FOUR. This being an ordinance for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor.
