

St. Louis City Ordinance 64004

FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

BOARD BILL NO. [96] 308

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN STEPHEN CONWAY , STEPHEN GREGALI

An ordinance pertaining to health care services, authorizing and directing the Health Commissioner of the City of St. Louis, to immunize proprietors and employees of restaurants, day care centers and others against hepatitis "A" providing reasonable fees for administration and delivery of said inoculations; authorizing and directing the Comptroller to establish a special purpose account where said funds from said immunizations shall be placed to be used only for health services and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. The Health Commissioner is hereby authorized and directed to provide hepatitis "A" vaccinations to proprietors and employees of restaurant, day care centers and others deemed necessary by the Health Commissioner. The Department of Health and Hospitals shall make its facilities and staff available to provide immunizations. The Department of Health and Hospitals shall establish and collect reasonable fees for providing such services.

SECTION TWO. The Health Commissioner is further authorized and directed to issue to restaurants, day care facilities and other entities in voluntary compliance with this ordinance, a certificate of compliance appropriate for public display. The Department of Health and Hospitals shall establish rules and regulations for a voluntary compliance program.

SECTION THREE. The Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to establish a special purpose account where funds from said immunizations shall be placed and said funds shall only be used for the purchasing, maintenance and delivery of hepatitis "A" vaccines.

SECTION FOUR. Emergency Clause. This being an ordinance for the preservation of public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
