

St. Louis City Ordinance

FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

BOARD BILL NO. [98] 122

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN PHYLLIS YOUNG

An Ordinance pertaining to Soulard Market; authorizing and directing the Director of Public Utilities, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute an Agreement with the Agricultural Marketing Service, United States Department of Agriculture, for a grant to fund professional design plans for the redevelopment of Soulard Market; appropriating said grant funds; and authorizing the Director of Public Utilities, on behalf of the City, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the grant funds by entering into contracts or otherwise providing for the needed services at Soulard Market and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: The Director of Public Utilities is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the City of St. Louis, to enter into and execute an Agreement with the Agricultural Marketing Service, United States Department of Agriculture, for a grant to fund professional design plans for the redevelopment of Soulard Market. Said Agreement shall conform substantially in words and figures to the attached Agreement which is made part of this Ordinance and is on file in the Register's Office.

SECTION TWO: Upon receipt of monies received pursuant to this Agreement, in a maximum amount not to exceed \$25,000, the grant monies are hereby appropriated into Fund 1137, Center 4140001, Account 4311010.

SECTION THREE: The Director of Public Utilities is hereby authorized and directed, upon approval of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, to expend the grant funds, by contract or otherwise, in a manner that is consistent with the provisions of said Agreement, from Fund 1137, Center 4140001, Account 5804000 (Soulard Design).

SECTION FOUR: Emergency Clause. This being an Ordinance for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an immediate measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
