

St. Louis City Ordinance 64632

FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

BOARD BILL NO. [98] 92

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN GREGORY CARTER

An ordinance pertaining to liquor licenses in the geographic area comprising the twenty-seventh ward; prohibiting the issuance of a 3:00 a.m. closing permit to any person for a premises which is not a resort within the geographic area known as the twenty-seventh ward as established by ordinance 62476; and further prohibiting the sale, giving away or disposing of intoxicating liquor or nonintoxicating beer by any person to whom a package license has been issued for any premise within the geographic area known as the twenty-seventh ward as established by ordinance 62476 after 10:00 p.m. each night of the week or before 10:00 a.m. Monday through Saturday and 12 Noon on Sunday and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. Notwithstanding any other provision of Title 14 of the Revised Code to the contrary, no 3:00 a.m. closing permit shall be issued to any person or business for premises which is not a resort located within the geographic area known as the twenty-seventh ward as established by ordinance 62476 and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of Northcrest and the City limits and proceeding along the centerlines in a generally clockwise direction south to Veronica, west to Goodfellow, southwest to Oxford Lane, south to Switzer, west to Goodfellow, south to the railroad tracks, east to Riverview, south to West Florissant, southeast to Emerson, southwest to Lilian, northwest to Genevieve, southwest to the Mark Twain Expressway, west to the western City limits, and north and east along the City limits to the point of beginning.

SECTION TWO. Notwithstanding any other provision of Title 14 of the Revised Code to the contrary, no person to whom a package license has been issued for premises within the geographic area known as the twenty-seventh ward as established by ordinance 62476, his agent, servant or employee shall sell, give away, or otherwise dispose of on the premises for which such license has been issued, or suffer or permit the same to be done upon such license premises, any intoxicating liquor or nonintoxicating beer in any quantity after 10:00 p.m. each night of the week or before 10:00 a.m. Monday through Saturday and 12 Noon on Sunday.

SECTION THREE. The provisions of this ordinance shall apply to all new applications for package licenses and 3:00 a.m. closing permits within the geographic area described herein as of the effective date of such ordinance and shall further apply to all existing licenses and permits as of the first renewal date of such license or permit subsequent to the ordinance's effective date.

SECTION FOUR. Emergency clause.

This being an ordinance for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor.
