

St. Louis City Ordinance 64715

FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

BOARD BILL NO. [99] 115

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN FRANCIS G. SLAY

An ordinance recommended by the Board of Public Service and the Board of Estimate and Apportionment authorizing the Board of Police Commissioners to purchase certain equipment and services to be used by the St. Louis Police Department; authorizing the Department of the President of the Board of Public Service to let contracts, employ and pay for labor, wages, consultants, and otherwise provide for designing, constructing, reconstructing, replacing, remodeling, repairing, furnishing, rehabilitating, renovating and equipping buildings and appurtenances thereto; authorizing the purchase of real property necessary to provide for said improvements for the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department; containing sections for description of the work, approval of plans and specifications, work and material guarantees, estimated costs and reversion and cost center transfer authorization, applicable state and federal wage rate requirements, equal opportunity provisions, the Mayor's Executive Orders and contract advertising statutes; appropriating the sum of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) from the proceeds from the sale of Bonds, the issuance of which was authorized by the passage of Proposition Two at an election held on the 3rd day of November, 1998, pursuant to Ordinance No. 64419 approved July 28, 1998 and the sale of which was authorized by Ordinance No. 64641, approved February 24, 1999 to pay for such equipment, services and renovations and containing a public works emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. The Board of Police Commissioners is hereby authorized and directed to purchase for use by the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department the following equipment and related services:

- a) Forensic Laboratory Equipment and Improvements
- b) Renovations and Improvements at Headquarters Building

SECTION TWO. There is hereby appropriated and set apart out of proceeds realized from the sale of Bonds of the City of St. Louis, the issuance of which was authorized by the passage of Proposition Two at an election held on the 3rd day of November, 1998, pursuant to Ordinance No. 64419 approved July 28,

1998 and the sale of which was authorized by Ordinance No. 64641 approved February 24, 1999, the amount of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) to pay for the items listed in a) and b) above. Transfers of appropriations between cost centers established in Section Three may be made if such transfers are not more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) per occurrence and are approved by the Budget Director and the Comptroller. Transfers of appropriations between cost centers which are greater than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) per occurrence must be approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

SECTION THREE. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to establish necessary and customary accounting procedures to provide assurance that funds appropriated in Section Two above are properly accounted for on the books of the City including the establishment of cost centers and amounts as shown following:

SECTION FOUR. The Board of Public Service is hereby authorized to let contracts, employ and pay for labor, wages, consultants, employees, equipment, supervision and otherwise provide for designing, constructing, reconstructing, replacing, remodeling, repairing, furnishing, rehabilitating, renovating and equipping buildings and appurtenances thereto of the St. Louis Police Department, consisting of, but not limited to, materials associated with masonry, cast-in-place concrete, landscaping, glass, built up roofing, plumbing, electrical wiring and fixtures, heating ventilating and cooling equipment, lumber, steel, fine metals, and necessary builders hardware.

SECTION FIVE. The work provided for in Section Four herein shall be carried out in accordance with detailed plans and specifications to be approved by the Board of Public Service before bids are advertised therefor.

SECTION SIX. If let by contract, said contract or contracts, shall provide that the contractor or contractors doing said work, shall guarantee and keep in repair all of the work, equipment, and materials used in connection therewith for a term of at least one year, commencing on the date of acceptance of the work by the City.

SECTION SEVEN. All contracts for the purchase of goods or services pursuant to this ordinance shall be approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment prior to being executed.

SECTION EIGHT. All equipment purchased under authority of this ordinance including hardware, software, systems containing commercial information technology products, and systems containing embedded technology shall be warranted by the manufacturer, vendor and/or contractor to be able to accurately process date/time data (including, but not limited to calculating, comparing, and sequencing) from, into, and between the twentieth and twenty-first centuries and the years 1999 and 2000 and leap year calculations to the extent that other information used in combination with the information technology being acquired properly exchanges date/time data with it.

SECTION NINE. This being an ordinance providing for public work improvements, and for the immediate preservation of Public Safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
