

## *St. Louis City Ordinance 64952*

FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

BOARD BILL NO. [00] 37

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN PHYLLIS YOUNG, DIONNE FLOWERS,  
APRIL FORD GRIFFIN

An ordinance pertaining to vehicles and traffic, repealing Section 17.16.040 of Section One of Ordinance 57831, approved on April 19, 1979, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section prohibiting any person from driving a vehicle upon a sidewalk except upon a permanent or duly authorized temporary driveway or upon a designated bicycle/pedestrian right of way; further amending Section One of Ordinance 57831 by adding a new section defining the term “bicycle right of way”; containing exceptions and an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE. Section 17.16.040 of Section One of Ordinance 57831, approved on April 19, 1979, is hereby repealed and enacted in lieu thereof is the following new section:

SECTION TWO. 17.16.040 Driving upon sidewalk or bicycle/pedestrian right of way.

A) No person shall drive any vehicle upon a sidewalk except upon a permanent or duly authorized temporary driveway.

B) No person shall drive any vehicle upon any bicycle/pedestrian right of way. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to persons driving emergency vehicles or maintenance vehicles, persons who drive upon any bicycle/pedestrian right of way as a means of ingress or egress to a place of business or a residence or persons crossing any bicycle/pedestrian right of way at a point designated by Grace Hill Americorp.as a river access crossing site.

SECTION THREE. Section One of Ordinance 57831 is hereby amended by adding a new section to be codified as 17.02.081 and to reads as follows:

17.02.081 Bicycle/pedestrian right of way

That portion of any street, roadway, sidewalk, public easement or other public place where its primary use has been designated for use by persons riding a bicycle or tricycle or by persons walking, running or skating. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the use of any such designated place by a disabled person in a wheelchair or similar device.

**SECTION FOUR. Emergency clause.**

This being an ordinance for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor.
