

1 **BOARD BILL NO. 265 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN JOSEPH VACCARO**

2 An ordinance relating to delinquent payments and associated fees repealing Ordinance 52783,
3 codified as 8.06.080 of the Revised Code of the City of St. Louis, and containing an emergency
4 clause.

5 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

6 **SECTION ONE:** Ordinance 52783, codified as 8.06.080 of the Revised Code of the City of St.
7 Louis is hereby repealed and a new section is enacted in lieu thereof to read as follows:

8 08.06.080 – Fees –Payment –Delay.

9 The License Collector shall have available in his office all the forms for the applications
10 for the licenses on or before June 1 of each year and the licensee shall secure and file the forms
11 with the License Collector on or before July 15 of each year. The tax payments due under the
12 provisions of this chapter shall be paid and shall become delinquent on the 16th day of July each
13 year.

14 Whenever any license tax, as fixed by this chapter and due July 1, or any other date as
15 prescribed by this chapter, shall have remained unpaid for sixty days after the time at which the
16 same was due, the amount of the license tax thereafter payable shall be twenty percent greater
17 than the amount of the tax as fixes in appropriate sections of this chapter; and said amount shall
18 increase by five-percent (5%) each month thereafter until the same is paid, provided that this
19 section shall not be deemed a waiver of the right of any court to impose a penalty for the
20 violation of the ordinances of the City respecting the time when any license tax is due.

21 **SECTION TWO: EMERGENCY CLAUSE.**

22 This being an ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the health and

1 welfare of the residents of the City of St. Louis, it is hereby declared to be an emergency
2 measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St.
3 Louis and therefore this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and
4 approval by the Mayor.
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
