

1 **BOARD BILL NO. 266 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN JOSEPH VACCARO**

2 An ordinance relating to penalties for delinquency in filing required documents with the License  
3 Collector and removing the maximum fine of twenty-five percent (25%); repealing Ordinance  
4 54982, codified as 8.06.090 of the Revised Code of the City of St. Louis, and containing an  
5 emergency clause.

6 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

7 **SECTION ONE:** Ordinance 54982, codified as 8.06.090 of the Revised Code of the City of St.  
8 Louis is hereby repealed and a new section is enacted in lieu thereof to read as follows:

9 08.06.090 – Penalty for delinquent filing.

10 Whenever any person, firm or corporation is required by the terms of this chapter to file a  
11 statement, application or return with the License Collector or Comptroller of the City as a  
12 condition precedent to the granting of a license under the provisions of this chapter and fails to  
13 file such statement, application or return with the License Collector or Comptroller of the City  
14 within the time required by any provision of this chapter, such person, firm or corporation shall  
15 pay to the License Collector a penalty of five-percent (5%) of the tax due and payable for each  
16 month, or fraction thereof, the statement, application or return remains delinquent. No license  
17 shall be issued by the License Collector until the penalty for delinquent filing of such statement,  
18 application or return shall be paid in full. This penalty shall be in addition to the other penalties  
19 and forfeitures now provided in this chapter.

20 **SECTION TWO: EMERGENCY CLAUSE.**

21 This being an ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the health and  
22 welfare of the residents of the City of St. Louis, it is hereby declared to be an emergency

1 measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St.  
2 Louis and therefore this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and  
3 approval by the Mayor.
