

1 **BOARD BILL #92**

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN JOSEPH RODDY

2 An Ordinance Approving The Petition Of Various Owners Of Certain Real Property To
3 Establish A Community Improvement District, Establishing The Euclid South Community
4 Improvement District, Finding A Public Purpose For The Establishment Of The Euclid South
5 Community Improvement District, And Containing An Emergency Clause And A Severability
6 Clause.

7 **WHEREAS**, Mo. Rev. Stat. §67.1400 *et seq.* (the “CID Act”) authorized the Board of
8 Aldermen to approve the petitions of property owners to establish a Community Improvement
9 District; and

10 **WHEREAS**, a petition has been filed with the City, requesting formation and
11 establishment of The Euclid South Community Improvement District, signed by owners or
12 authorized representatives of the owners of more than fifty percent by assessed value and per
13 capita of the property located within the proposed boundaries of The Euclid South Community
14 Improvement District (as amended, the “Petition”); and

15 **WHEREAS**, the Register of the City of St. Louis did review and determine that the
16 Petition substantially complies with the requirements of the CID Act; and

17 **WHEREAS**, a public hearing, duly noticed and conducted as required by and in
18 accordance with the CID Act was held at 9:00 a.m. on _____, 2014, by the Board of
19 Aldermen; and

20 **WHEREAS**, this Board of Aldermen hereby finds that the adoption of this ordinance is
21 in the best interest of the City of St. Louis and that the owners of real property located within
22 The Euclid South Community Improvement District, as well as the City as a whole, will benefit
23 from the establishment of The Euclid South Community Improvement District.

1 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

2 **SECTION ONE.**

3 (a) A community improvement district, to be known as “The Euclid South
4 Community Improvement District” (hereinafter referred to as the “District”), is hereby
5 established pursuant to the CID Act on certain real property described below to provide services,
6 construct improvements, impose taxes and carry out other functions as set forth in the Petition,
7 which is attached hereto as Appendix A and incorporated herein by this reference.

8 (b) The District boundaries are set forth in the Petition and are generally
9 described as follows: Kingshighway on its most Western boundary; Lindell Avenue on its most
10 Northern boundary; Taylor Avenue on its most Eastern boundary; and Forest Park Avenue on its
11 most Southern boundary, provided that said boundaries are irregular and do not encompass all
12 parcels located therein.

13 **SECTION TWO.** The District is authorized by the Petition, in accordance with the CID
14 Act, to impose a tax upon retail sales within the District to provide funds to accomplish any
15 power, duty or purpose of the District.

16 **SECTION THREE.** The District is authorized by the CID Act, at any time, to issue
17 obligations, or to enter into agreements with other entities with the authority to issue obligations,
18 for the purpose of carrying out any of its powers, duties, or purposes. Such obligations shall be
19 payable out of all, part or any combination of the revenues of the District and may be further
20 secured by all or any part of any property or any interest in any property by mortgage or any
21 other security interest granted. Such obligations shall be authorized by resolution of the District,
22 and if issued by the District, shall bear such date or dates, and shall mature at such time or times,
23 but not more than twenty (20) years from the date of issuance, as the resolution shall specify.

1 Such obligations shall be in such denomination, bear interest at such rate or rates, be in such
2 form, be payable in such place or places, be subject to redemption as such resolution may
3 provide and be sold at either public or private sale at such prices as the District shall determine
4 subject to the provisions of Mo. Rev. Stat. §108.170. The District is also authorized to issue
5 such obligations to refund, in whole or part, obligations previously issued by the District.

6 **SECTION FOUR.**

7 (a) Pursuant to the Petition, the District shall be in the form of a political
8 subdivision of the State of Missouri, known as “The Euclid South Community Improvement
9 District.”

10 (b) Pursuant to Section 67.1471 of the CID Act, the fiscal year for the District
11 shall be the same as the fiscal year for the City of St. Louis.

12 (c) No earlier than one hundred and eighty (180) days and no later than ninety
13 (90) days prior to the first day of each fiscal year, the District shall submit to the Board of
14 Aldermen a proposed annual budget for the District, setting forth expected expenditures,
15 revenues, and rates of assessments, if any, for such fiscal year. The Board of Aldermen may
16 review and comment on this proposed budget, but if such comments are given, the Board of
17 Aldermen shall provide such written comments no later than sixty (60) days prior to the first day
18 of the relevant fiscal year; such comments shall not constitute requirements, but shall only be
19 recommendations.

20 (d) The District shall hold an annual meeting and adopt an annual budget no later
21 than thirty (30) days prior to the first day of each fiscal year.

1 **SECTION FIVE.** The District is authorized to use the funds of the District for any of
2 the improvements, services or other activities authorized in the Petition and under the CID Act,
3 which funds will be used within the boundaries of the District as required by the CID Act.

4 **SECTION SIX.** Pursuant to the CID Act, the District shall have all of the powers
5 necessary to carry out and effectuate the purposes of the District and the CID Act as set forth in
6 the Petition and under the CID Act.

7 **SECTION SEVEN.** The City of St. Louis hereby finds that the uses of the District
8 proceeds as provided for in the Petition hereto, which proceeds will be used within the
9 boundaries of the District as required by the CID Act, will serve a public purpose by encouraging
10 the redevelopment of real property within the District.

11 **SECTION EIGHT.** Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the end of each fiscal
12 year, the District shall submit a report to the Register of the City and the Missouri Department of
13 Economic Development stating the services provided, revenues collected and expenditures made
14 by the District during such fiscal year, and copies of written resolutions approved by the board of
15 directors of the District during the fiscal year. The Register shall retain this report as part of the
16 official records of the City and shall also cause this report to be spread upon the records of the
17 Board of Aldermen, pursuant to Section 67.1471 of the CID Act.

18 **SECTION NINE.** The term for the existence of the District shall be as set forth in the
19 Petition, as may be amended from time to time or as such term may be otherwise modified in
20 accordance with the CID Act.

21 **SECTION TEN.** Pursuant to the CID Act, the Board of Aldermen shall not decrease the
22 level of publicly funded services in the District existing prior to the creation of the District or
23 transfer the burden of providing the services to the District unless the services at the same time

1 are decreased throughout the City, nor shall the Board of Aldermen discriminate in the provision
2 of the publicly funded services between areas included in the District and areas not so included.

3 **SECTION ELEVEN.** The Register shall report in writing the creation of the District to
4 the Missouri Department of Economic Development.

5 **SECTION TWELVE.** The Petition provides that the District shall be governed by a
6 Board of Directors consisting of seven individual directors (collectively the “Directors” and each
7 a “Director”), such Directors to be appointed by the Mayor of the City with the consent of the
8 Board of Aldermen, in accordance with the CID Act and the qualifications set forth in the
9 Petition. By his approval of this ordinance, the Mayor does hereby appoint the following named
10 individuals as Directors of the District for the terms set forth below, and by adoption of this
11 ordinance, the Board of Aldermen hereby consents to such appointments:

22 **SECTION THIRTEEN.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of
23 this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional, or unlawful for any reason, by any court
24 of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed and is hereby declared to be a separate,

1 distinct and independent provision of this ordinance, and such holding or holdings shall not
2 affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

3 **SECTION FOURTEEN.** The Board of Aldermen hereby finds and determines that this
4 ordinance constitutes an “emergency measure” pursuant to Article IV, Section 20 of the City
5 Charter, because this Ordinance establishes the District, which is a taxing district, and as such,
6 this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the Mayor as provided in
7 Article IV, Section 20 of the City Charter.
