

1 **BOARD BILL NO.111 INTRODUCED BY: ALDERMAN MATT VILLA**

2 An ordinance authorizing and directing execution of a Cooperation  
3 Agreement between the City of St. Louis and the YMCA of Greater St.. Louis  
4 (the “YMCA” ), a Missouri not-for-profit corporation , which provides for the  
5 operation by the YMCA of a City recreation facility in Carondelet Park.

6 **WHEREAS**, the City is constructing a recreation facility (the “Facility”) in  
7 Carondelet Park; and

8 **WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the City to have the Facility operated  
9 by the YMCA; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the City and the YMCA desire to enter into a Cooperation  
11 Agreement, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, which  
12 provides terms of agreement for the operation and maintenance of the Facility;

13 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS**  
14 **AS FOLLOWS:**

15 **SECTION ONE.** The Director of Parks, Recreation and Forestry, the President  
16 of the Board of Public Service and the Comptroller are hereby authorized and  
17 directed to enter into and execute on behalf of the City of St. Louis a  
18 Cooperation Agreement with the YMCA of Greater St. Louis with respect to

1 the recreation facility being constructed in Carondelet Park, in substantially in  
2 the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein by this  
3 reference, with such changes or modifications consistent with this ordinance as  
4 may be approved by such officers and the City Counselor, with their signatures  
5 being conclusive evidence of their approval of the form of such document, as  
6 well as any other documents that are necessary or appropriate to effectuate the  
7 intent of this ordinance.

8 **SECTION TWO.** This ordinance, being deemed necessary for the immediate  
9 preservation of the public health and safety, is declared to be an emergency  
10 measure as that term is used in Article IV, Sections 19 and 20 of the Charter.
