

1 **AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING A PORTION OF THE CITY OF ST.**
2 **LOUIS, MISSOURI, AS A REDEVELOPMENT AREA KNOWN AS THE**
3 **I-70 AND GOODFELLOW AREA, 4800-50 GOODFELLOW BLVD.**
4 **PURSUANT TO THE REAL PROPERTY TAX INCREMENT**
5 **ALLOCATION REDEVELOPMENT ACT; APPROVING A**
6 **REDEVELOPMENT PLAN AND A REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT WITH**
7 **RESPECT THERETO; ADOPTING TAX INCREMENT FINANCING**
8 **WITHIN THE REDEVELOPMENT AREA; MAKING FINDINGS WITH**
9 **RESPECT THERETO; ESTABLISHING THE I-70 AND GOODFELLOW**
10 **AREA, 4800-50 GOODFELLOW BLVD. SPECIAL ALLOCATION FUND;**
11 **AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS BY CITY OFFICIALS; AND**
12 **CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.**

13 **WHEREAS**, the City of St. Louis, Missouri (the “City”), is a body corporate and a
14 political subdivision of the State of Missouri, duly created, organized and existing under and by
15 virtue of its charter, the Constitution and laws of the State of Missouri; and

16 **WHEREAS**, on December 20, 1991, pursuant to Ordinance No. 62477, the Board of
17 Aldermen of the City created the Tax Increment Financing Commission of the City of St. Louis,
18 Missouri (the “TIF Commission”); and

19 **WHEREAS**, the TIF Commission is duly constituted according to the Real Property Tax
20 Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, Sections 99.800 to 99.865 of the Revised Statutes of
21 Missouri (2000), as amended (the “TIF Act”), and is authorized to hold public hearings with

1 respect to proposed redevelopment areas and redevelopment plans and to make
2 recommendations thereon to the City; and

3 **WHEREAS**, staff and consultants of the City and Goodfellow Acquisitions, Inc., a
4 Missouri corporation (the “Developer”), prepared a plan for redevelopment titled “I-70 and
5 Goodfellow Area 4800-50 Goodfellow Blvd. Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Plan” dated April
6 30, 2005 (the “Redevelopment Plan”), for an area generally located at Interstate 70 and
7 Goodfellow Blvd. and commonly known and numbered as 4800-50 Goodfellow Blvd. in the City
8 (the “Redevelopment Area” or “Area”), which Redevelopment Area is more fully described in
9 the Redevelopment Plan, attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit A**; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the Redevelopment Plan proposes to redevelop the Redevelopment Area by
11 demolishing the structures that currently exist in the Area, completing environmental
12 remediation of the Area, and construction of new commercial uses together with necessary
13 public improvements to support such uses, all as further set forth in the Redevelopment Plan (the
14 “Redevelopment Project,” or “TIF Project”); and

15 **WHEREAS**, on June 15, 2005 after all proper notice was given, the TIF Commission
16 held a public hearing in conformance with the TIF Act and received comments from all
17 interested persons and taxing districts relative to the Redevelopment Area, the Redevelopment
18 Plan, and the Redevelopment Project; and

19 **WHEREAS**, on June 15, 2005, the TIF Commission found that adoption of the
20 Redevelopment Plan and tax increment financing within the Area by the City and completion of
21 the Redevelopment Project would provide a substantial and significant public benefit through the
22 creation of new jobs, the elimination of blight, the strengthening of the employment and
23 economic base of the City, increased property values and tax revenues, stabilization of the

1 Redevelopment Area, and facilitation of economic stability for the City as a whole, and further
2 found that without the assistance of tax increment financing in accordance with the TIF Act, the
3 Redevelopment Project is not financially feasible and would not otherwise be completed; and

4 **WHEREAS**, on June 15, 2005, the TIF Commission voted to recommend that the Board
5 of Aldermen adopt an ordinance in the form required by the Act (i) adopting tax increment
6 financing within the Redevelopment Area, (ii) approving the Redevelopment Plan, (iii)
7 approving and designating the Redevelopment Area as a “redevelopment area” as provided in
8 the Act, (iv) approving the Redevelopment Project as described within the Redevelopment Plan,
9 and (v) approving the issuance of tax increment financing revenue notes in the amount as
10 specified in the Redevelopment Plan; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the Developer has demonstrated that the Redevelopment Project would not
12 reasonably be anticipated to be developed without the adoption of tax increment financing and,
13 therefore, redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area in accordance with the Redevelopment
14 Plan is not feasible and would not otherwise be completed; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the Board of Aldermen has received the recommendations of the TIF
16 Commission regarding the Redevelopment Area and the Redevelopment Plan and finds that it is
17 desirable and in the best interests of the City to designate the Redevelopment Area as a
18 “redevelopment area” as provided in the TIF Act, adopt the Redevelopment Plan and
19 Redevelopment Project in order to encourage and facilitate the redevelopment of the
20 Redevelopment Area; and

21 **WHEREAS**, the Redevelopment Area qualifies for the use of tax increment financing to
22 alleviate the conditions that qualify it as a “blighted area” as provided in the TIF Act and as set
23 forth herein; and

1 **WHEREAS**, it is necessary and desirable and in the best interest of the City to adopt tax
2 increment allocation financing within the Redevelopment Area and to establish a special
3 allocation fund for the Redevelopment Area in order to provide for the promotion of the general
4 welfare through redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area in accordance with the
5 Redevelopment Plan which redevelopment includes, but is not limited to, assistance in the
6 physical, economic, and social development of the City of St. Louis, providing for a stabilized
7 population and plan for the optimal growth of the City of St. Louis, encouragement of a sense of
8 community identity, safety and civic pride, and the elimination of impediments to land
9 disposition and development in the City of St. Louis.

10 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

11 **SECTION ONE.** The Board of Aldermen hereby makes the following findings:

12 A. The Redevelopment Area on the whole is a “blighted area”, as defined in Section
13 99.805(1) of the TIF Act, and has not been subject to growth and development through
14 investment by private enterprise and would not reasonably be anticipated to be developed
15 without the adoption of tax increment financing. This finding includes, the Redevelopment Plan
16 sets forth, and the Board of Aldermen hereby finds and adopts by reference: (i) a detailed
17 description of the factors that qualify the Redevelopment Area as a “blighted area” and (ii) an
18 affidavit, signed by the developer and submitted with the Redevelopment Plan, attesting that the
19 provisions of Section 99.810.1(1) of the TIF Act have been met, which description and affidavit
20 are incorporated herein as if set forth herein.

21 B. The Redevelopment Plan conforms to the comprehensive plan for the
22 development of the City as a whole.

23 C. In accordance with the TIF Act, the Redevelopment Plan states the estimated

1 dates of completion of the Redevelopment Project and retirement of the financial obligations
2 issued to pay for certain redevelopment project costs and these dates are twenty three (23) years
3 or less from the date of approval of the Redevelopment Project.

4 D. A plan has been developed for relocation assistance for businesses and residences
5 in Ordinance No. 62481 adopted December 20, 1991.

6 E. A cost-benefit analysis showing the economic impact of the Redevelopment Plan
7 on each taxing district which is at least partially within the boundaries of the Redevelopment
8 Area is on file with the St. Louis Development Corporation, which cost-benefit analysis shows
9 the impact on the economy if the Redevelopment Project is not built, and is built pursuant to the
10 Redevelopment Plan.

11 F. Redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area in accordance with the
12 Redevelopment Plan is not financially feasible without the assistance of tax increment financing
13 and would not otherwise be completed.

14 G. The Redevelopment Plan does not include the initial development or
15 redevelopment of any “gambling establishment” as that term is defined in Section 99.805(6) of
16 the TIF Act.

17 H. The Redevelopment Area includes only those parcels of real property and
18 improvements thereon directly and substantially benefited by the proposed Redevelopment
19 Project.

20 **SECTION TWO.** The Redevelopment Area described in the Redevelopment Plan is
21 hereby designated as a “redevelopment area” as defined in Section 99.805(11) of the TIF Act.

22 **SECTION THREE.** The Redevelopment Plan as reviewed and recommended by the
23 TIF Commission on June 15, 2005, including amendments thereto, if any, and the

1 Redevelopment Project described in the Redevelopment Plan are hereby adopted and approved.
2 A copy of the Redevelopment Plan is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by
3 reference.

4 **SECTION FOUR.** There is hereby created and ordered to be established within the
5 treasury of the City a separate fund to be known as the “I-70 and Goodfellow Area 4800-50
6 Goodfellow Blvd. Special Allocation Fund (the “Special Allocation Fund”).” To the extent
7 permitted by law and except as otherwise provided in the Redevelopment Plan, the City hereby
8 pledges funds in the Special Allocation Fund for the payment of redevelopment project costs and
9 obligations incurred in the payment thereof.

10 **SECTION FIVE.** Tax increment allocation financing is hereby adopted within the
11 Redevelopment Area. After the total equalized assessed valuation of the taxable real property in
12 the Redevelopment Area exceeds the certified total initial equalized assessed valuation of the
13 taxable real property in the Redevelopment Area, the ad valorem taxes, and payments in lieu of
14 taxes, if any, arising from the levies upon taxable real property in the Redevelopment Area by
15 taxing districts and tax rates determined in the manner provided in Section 99.855.2 of the TIF
16 Act each year after the effective date of this Ordinance until redevelopment costs have been paid
17 shall be divided as follows:

18 A. That portion of taxes, penalties and interest levied upon each taxable lot, block,
19 tract, or parcel of real property which is attributable to the initial equalized assessed value of
20 each such taxable lot, block, tract, or parcel of real property in the area selected for the
21 Redevelopment Project shall be allocated to and, when collected, shall be paid by the City
22 Collector to the respective affected taxing districts in the manner required by law in the absence
23 of the adoption of tax increment allocation financing;

1 B. Payments in lieu of taxes attributable to the increase in the current equalized
2 assessed valuation of each taxable lot, block, tract, or parcel of real property in the area selected
3 for the Redevelopment Project and any applicable penalty and interest over and above the initial
4 equalized assessed value of each such unit of property in the area selected for the
5 Redevelopment Project shall be allocated to and, when collected, shall be paid to the City
6 Treasurer, who shall deposit such payment in lieu of taxes into the Special Allocation Fund for
7 the purpose of paying redevelopment costs and obligations incurred in the payment thereof.
8 Payments in lieu of taxes which are due and owing shall constitute a lien against the real estate
9 of the Redevelopment Project from which they are derived and shall be collected in the same
10 manner as the real property tax, including the assessment of penalties and interest where
11 applicable.

12 **SECTION SIX.** In addition to the payments in lieu of taxes described in Section Five of
13 this Ordinance, fifty percent (50%) of the total additional revenue from taxes, penalties and
14 interest which are imposed by the City or other taxing districts, and which are generated by
15 economic activities within the area of the Redevelopment Project over the amount of such taxes
16 generated by economic activities within the area of the Redevelopment Project in the calendar
17 year prior to the adoption of the Redevelopment Project by ordinance, while tax increment
18 financing remains in effect, but excluding personal property taxes, taxes imposed on sales or
19 charges for sleeping rooms paid by transient guests of hotels and motels, taxes levied pursuant to
20 Section 70.500 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (2000) as amended, or taxes levied for the
21 purpose of public transportation pursuant to Section 94.660 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri
22 (2000) as amended, licenses, fees or special assessments other than payments in lieu of taxes and
23 penalties and interest thereon, shall be allocated to, and paid by the collecting officer to the City

1 Treasurer or other designated financial officer of the City, who shall deposit such funds in a
2 separate segregated account within the SLAAP Site Special Allocation Fund.

3 **SECTION SEVEN.** The Comptroller of the City is hereby authorized to enter into
4 agreements or contracts with other taxing districts as is necessary to ensure the allocation and
5 collection of the taxes and payments in lieu of taxes described in Sections Five and Six of this
6 Ordinance and the deposit of the said taxes or payments in lieu of taxes into the Special
7 Allocation Fund for the payment of redevelopment project costs and obligations incurred in the
8 payment thereof, all in accordance with the TIF Act.

9 **SECTION EIGHT.** The City Register is hereby directed to submit a certified copy of
10 this Ordinance to the City Assessor, who is directed to determine the total equalized assessed
11 value of all taxable real property within the Redevelopment Area as of the date of this
12 Ordinance, by adding together the most recently ascertained equalized assessed value of each
13 taxable lot, block, tract or parcel of real property within the Redevelopment Area, and shall
14 certify such amount as the total initial equalized assessed value of the taxable real property
15 within the Redevelopment Area.

16 **SECTION NINE.** The Mayor and Comptroller of the City or their designated
17 representatives are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions as may be
18 necessary and appropriate in order to carry out the matters herein authorized, with no such
19 further action of the Board of Aldermen necessary to authorize such action by the Mayor and the
20 Comptroller or their designated representatives.

21 **SECTION TEN.** The Mayor and the Comptroller or their designated representatives,
22 with the advice and concurrence of the City Counselor and after approval by the Board of
23 Estimate and Apportionment, are hereby further authorized and directed to make any changes to

1 the documents, agreements and instruments approved and authorized by this Ordinance as may
2 be consistent with the intent of this Ordinance and necessary and appropriate in order to carry
3 out the matters herein authorized, with no such further action of the Board of Aldermen
4 necessary to authorize such changes by the Mayor and the Comptroller or their designated
5 representatives.

6 **SECTION ELEVEN.** It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Board of Aldermen
7 that each and every part, section and subsection of this Ordinance shall be separate and severable
8 from each and every other part, section and subsection hereof and that the Board of Aldermen
9 intends to adopt each said part, section and subsection separately and independently of any other
10 part, section and subsection. In the event that any part, section or subsection of this Ordinance
11 shall be determined to be or to have been unlawful or unconstitutional, the remaining parts,
12 sections and subsections shall be and remain in full force and effect, unless the court making
13 such finding shall determine that the valid portions standing alone are incomplete and are
14 incapable of being executed in accord with the legislative intent.

15 **SECTION TWELVE.** After adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Aldermen, this
16 Ordinance shall become effective on the 30th day after its approval by the Mayor or adoption
17 over his veto.
