

BOARD BILL NO. 336 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN GREGORY CARTER

1 An Ordinance, recommended and approved by the Board of Public Service of the City of
2 St. Louis (the "Board of Public Service"), establishing a public works and improvement project
3 for the design and construction of the Goodfellow Boulevard Improvement Project between
4 Lillian Avenue and the Halls Ferry Circle (the "Goodfellow Improvement Project"); and
5 authorizing and directing the City of St. Louis (the "City") by and through its Board of Public
6 Service to let contracts and provide for the design, construction, materials, and equipment for the
7 Goodfellow Improvement Project, authorizing the Board of Public Service to employ labor and
8 consultants, pay salaries, fees and wages, acquire real property interests, and to enter into
9 supplemental agreements with the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission, Federal
10 Highway Administration, utilities, and other governmental agencies for the Goodfellow
11 Improvement Project all in accordance with the federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st
12 Century (23 U.S.C. 110, et seq.), with any contract containing sections for: description of the
13 work, material guarantees, estimated expenditure allocations, fund reversion authorization,
14 applicable federal and state wage rate requirements, equal opportunity provisions, the Mayor's
15 Executive Orders, and contract advertising statutes; requiring that all work provided for herein
16 shall be carried out in accordance with detailed plans and specifications adopted and approved by
17 the Board of Public Service before bids are advertised therefor; directing that all construction
18 contracts let by authority of this Ordinance provide for federal and state prevailing wages
19 requirements including prevailing wage holiday and overtime pay and compliance with all
20 applicable statutes of the State of Missouri, the City Charter and the Revised Code of the City,
21 as amended; requiring all specifications approved by the Board of Public Service and contracts
22 let by authority of this Ordinance provide for compliance with the Mayor's Executive Orders on
23 Equal Opportunity and maximum MBE/WBE/DBE utilization goals, except when superseded or
24 prohibited by federal or state law or regulation; requiring all advertisements for bids pursuant to
25 this Ordinance be subject to the provisions of Section 8.250 RSMo., as amended; and

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1 appropriating the total estimated cost of Two Million Nine Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars
2 (\$2,950,000) of which the City's share is Five Hundred and Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$590,000)
3 for the Goodfellow Improvement Project as follows: Three Hundred and Ninety Thousand
4 Dollars (\$390,000) from the funds in the Federal Aid to Urban Program Match Share Fund, also
5 known as the Federal Aid to Urban Program Revolving Fund, established by Ordinance 56931,
6 and Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) from the One-Half Cent Ward Capital
7 Improvement Fund; authorizing and directing the Comptroller of the City to draw warrants from
8 time to time and disburse funds appropriated by this ordinance and to receive and disburse grant
9 funds in accordance with the Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century (23 U.S.C. 110, et
10 seq.) upon the signature and certification of vouchers by the President of the Board of Public
11 Service; and containing a public work emergency clause.

12 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:

13 SECTION ONE. There is hereby authorized a public works and improvement project for the
14 design and construction of the Goodfellow Boulevard Improvement Project between Lillian
15 Avenue and the Halls Ferry Circle (the "Goodfellow Improvement Project").

16 SECTION TWO. The City of St. Louis (the "City") by and through its Board of Public Service
17 (the "Board of Public Service") is hereby authorized and directed to let contracts and provide for
18 the design, construction, materials, and equipment, for the Goodfellow Improvement Project, to
19 employ labor and consultants, pay salaries, fees and wages, acquire real property interests for the
20 Goodfellow Improvement Project, to enter into supplemental agreements with the Missouri
21 Highway and Transportation Commission, Federal Highway Administration, utilities, and other
22 governmental agencies, all in accordance with the federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st
23 Century (23 U.S.C. 110, et seq.), with any contracts containing sections for: description of the
24 work, material guarantees, estimated expenditure allocations, fund reversion authorization,
25 applicable federal and state wage rate requirements, equal opportunity provisions, the Mayor's
26 Executive Orders, and contract advertising statutes.

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1 SECTION THREE. The work provided for herein shall be carried out in accordance with
2 detailed plans and specifications to be adopted and approved by the Board of Public Service
3 before bids are advertised therefor.

4 SECTION FOUR. All construction contracts let under authority of this Ordinance shall provide
5 that no less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages in the City, as determined in accordance
6 with the Federal Davis-Bacon Act and by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of
7 the State of Missouri (Sections 290.210 through 290.340 RSMo. 2000, as amended,) for each
8 craft or type of work needed in the actual labor on the jobs herein authorized, as well as the
9 general prevailing rate of pay for legal holidays and overtime work shall be paid to all workers
10 on the Goodfellow Improvement Project. All contracts let in connection with the construction
11 provided for herein shall be subject to, and in conformance with all applicable statutes of the
12 State of Missouri and the City Charter and Revised Code of the City, as amended.

13 SECTION FIVE. All specifications approved by the Board of Public Service and contracts let
14 under the authority of this Ordinance shall provide for compliance with the Mayor's Executive
15 Orders on Equal Opportunity and maximum MBE/WBE/DBE utilization goals, except when
16 otherwise superseded or prohibited by federal or state law or regulation.

17 SECTION SIX. All advertisement for bids pursuant to this Ordinance shall be subject to Section
18 8.250 RSMo. 2000, as amended.

19 SECTION SEVEN. The total estimated cost of the Goodfellow Improvement Project is Two
20 Million Nine Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,950,000) of which the City's share is Five
21 Hundred and Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$590,000). Funding is hereby appropriated to be used
22 for this project as follows: Three Hundred and Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$390,000) from the
23 funds in the Federal Aid to Urban Program Match Share Fund, also known as the Federal Aid to
24 Urban Program Revolving Fund, established by Ordinance 56931, and Two Hundred Thousand
25 Dollars (\$200,000) from the One-Half Cent Ward Capital Improvement Fund. Said

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1 improvements shall be contracted and executed in parts as funds are accrued in this Match Share
2 Fund and are adequate to pay the City's share of the cost.

3 SECTION EIGHT. The Comptroller of the City is hereby authorized and directed to draw
4 warrants from time to time and disburse funds appropriated by this ordinance and is further
5 authorized and directed to receive and disburse grant funds in accordance with the
6 Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century (23 U.S.C. 110, et seq.), upon the signature and
7 certification of vouchers by the President of the Board of Public Service. Reimbursement funds
8 received shall be deposited into the Federal Aid to Urban Program Match Share Fund Ordinance
9 56931.

10 SECTION NINE. The Board of Public Service is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the
11 City monetary donations from other governmental agencies and others to assist in paying for the
12 work authorized in this Ordinance. Funds received shall be deposited into the Federal Aid to
13 Urban Program Match Share Fund, also known as the Federal Aid to Urban Program Revolving
14 Fund, established by Ordinance 56931.

15 SECTION TEN. This being an ordinance providing for public work and improvement, it is
16 hereby declared to be an emergency measure as defined in Article IV, Sections 19 and 20 of the
17 City Charter and shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the
18 Mayor of the City.
