

1 **BOARD BILL NO. 497 INTRODUCED BY ALDERMAN DIONNE FLOWERS**

2 An ordinance prohibiting the issuance of any package liquor license for any non-
3 licensed premises within the boundaries of the Second Ward Liquor Control District, as
4 established herein, for a period of three years from the effective date hereof; containing
5 exceptions and allowing, during the moratorium period, for the transfer of existing
6 licenses, under certain circumstances, for the renewal of an existing license under the
7 provisions, and issuance of a drink license for premises operated as a restaurant under the
8 provisions ; and containing an emergency clause.

9 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

10 **SECTION ONE. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS.**

11 The existence of alcoholic beverage establishments appears to contribute directly
12 to numerous peace, health, safety and general welfare problems including loitering,
13 littering, drug trafficking, prostitution, public drunkenness, defacement and damaging of
14 structures, pedestrian obstructions, as well as traffic circulation, parking and noise
15 problems on public streets and neighborhood lots. The existence of such problems creates
16 serious impacts on the health, safety and welfare of residents of single- and multiple-
17 family within the district, including fear for the safety of children, elderly residents and of
18 visitors to the district. The problems also contribute to the deterioration of the
19 neighborhood and concomitant devaluation of property and destruction of community
20 values and quality of life. The number of establishments selling alcoholic beverages and
21 the associated problems discourage more desirable and needed commercial uses in the
22 area. In order to preserve the residential character and the neighborhood-serving
23 commercial uses of the area, there shall be a moratorium on the issuance of new liquor

1 licenses within the area beginning at the intersection of the Mississippi River and the
2 centerline of Branch St., and proceeding along the centerlines in a generally clockwise
3 direction west to the intersection of Interstate 70, north along Interstate 70 to E. Grand
4 Ave., west to Blair Ave., north to Linton Ave., west to Conde St., north to Adelaide Ave.,
5 east to the intersection with Interstate 70, generally west along Interstate 70 to West
6 Florissant Ave., north to Calvary Ave., northeast to N. Calvary Ave., north to N.
7 Broadway, north to Switzer Ave., northeast to Oriole Ave., north to McLaran Ave., west
8 to Riverview Blvd., south to the Norfolk & Western Railway tracks, west to Trafford Ln.,
9 north to McLaran Ave., east to Park Ln., north to the City limits to the northern edge of
10 the city limits, east along the city limits at Watkins Creek to the Mississippi River, and
11 southeast along the Mississippi River to the point of beginning. Such area shall be known
12 as the Second Ward Liquor Control Area.

13 **SECTION TWO.** The Excise Commissioner is hereby prohibited, for a period of
14 three years, beginning as of the effective date of this Ordinance, from approving the
15 issuance of a package liquor license for any premises which is located within the
16 boundaries of the Second Ward Liquor Control District established in Section One of this
17 ordinance.

18 **SECTION THREE.** Notwithstanding the provisions of Section Two of this
19 Ordinance, the Excise Commissioner shall have authority to:

20 (1) Approve transfer of an existing license to another premises within the petition
21 circle of the currently licensed premises, pursuant to the provisions of subsection (B) of
22 section 14.06.330 of Ordinance 61289; and

1 (2) Approve the renewal of an existing license under the provisions of Section
2 14.08.090 of Ordinance 62656.

3 (3) Issue a drink license for a premises, not licensed as of the effective date of this
4 Ordinance, which currently is or will be, upon opening, operated as a restaurant, as such
5 term is defined in section 14.01.390 of Ordinance 61289.

6 **SECTION FOUR. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.** This being an ordinance for the
7 preservation of public peace, health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency
8 measure within the meaning of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City
9 of St. Louis and therefore this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its
10 passage and approval by the Mayor.

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
