6 An ordinance prohibiting the operation of any vehicle on a street, alley,  
7 roadway, highway or parking lot open to the public by any person while that person's  
8 drivers license or driving privilege has been canceled, suspended or revoked by the State  
9 of Missouri and containing an emergency clause.

11 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

12 **SECTION ONE:** No person shall operate any motor vehicle on a street,  
13 alley roadway, highway or parking lot open to the public while that person's drivers  
14 license or driving privilege has been canceled, suspended or revoked by the State of  
15 Missouri, whether that person's license and driving privilege is that of a resident or a  
16 nonresident, with knowledge or constructive knowledge of the fact his driving privilege  
17 has been canceled, suspended or revoked.

18 **SECTION TWO:** Any person who actually knows or who was mailed an  
19 official notice, delivered to his last address on file with the Director of Revenue of the  
20 State of Missouri, that his/her drivers license or driving privilege has been canceled,  
21 suspended or revoked by the Director of Revenue of the State of Missouri shall be  
22 deemed to have knowledge or constructive knowledge that his/her drivers license or  
23 driving privilege has been canceled, suspended or revoked for purpose of this ordinance.

24                   **SECTION THREE:** Every person who pleads guilty to or is found guilty  
25 for the first time of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less  
26 than \$200 nor more than \$500 and/or imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days.  
27 Every person who pleads guilty to or is found guilty for a second or subsequent violation  
28 of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$500 and/or imprisonment  
29 for a term not to exceed 90 days. A judge may suspend the execution of the jail term but  
30 not the fine. A judge may not enter a “suspended imposition” of any sentence.

31                   **SECTION FOUR: Emergency Clause.** The passage of this Ordinance  
32 being deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, moral,  
33 safety, and general welfare, shall be and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure  
34 within the meaning of Article IV, Sections 19 and 20, of the Charter of the City of St.  
35 Louis, and, as such, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the  
36 Mayor.
