INTRODUCED BY JOSEPH

3 An ordinance repealing Section Three of Ordinance 67917 pertaining to the
4 issuance of any package or drink liquor licenses for premises within the boundaries of the
5 Tenth Ward Liquor Control District and in lieu thereof containing an exception allowing,
6 during the moratorium period, for the transfer of existing licenses, under certain
7 circumstances, the issuance of a drink license to persons operating a restaurant at a
8 previously non-licensed premises, and allowing package liquor at two locations; and
9 containing an emergency clause

10 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:**

11 **SECTION ONE.** Section Three of Ordinance 67917 is hereby repealed and in
12 lieu thereof a new section is enacted to read as follows:

13 **SECTION THREE.** Notwithstanding the provisions of Section Two of this
14 Ordinance, the Excise Commissioner shall have authority to:

15 (1) Approve transfer of an existing license to another premises within the petition
16 circle of the currently licensed premises, pursuant to the provisions of subsection
17 (B) of section 14.06.330 of Ordinance 61289; and

18 (2) Issue a drink license for a premises, not licensed as of the effective date of this
19 Ordinance, which currently is or will be, upon opening, operated as a restaurant,
20 as such term is defined in section 14.01.390 of Ordinance 61289.

21 (3) Issue a package license for any premises within the following area: Beginning
22 at the west curb line of South Kingshighway at the intersection of South
23 Kingshighway and Oleatha Avenue, thence north along South Kingshighway to
24 its intersection with Fyler Avenue; thence east to the east curb line of South

1 Kingshighway at the intersection of South Kingshighway and Fyler Avenue;
2 thence south along South Kingshighway to its intersection with Oleatha Avenue;
3 thence west to the point of beginning.

4 (4) Issue a 22% Package License (Wine and Beer License) for any premises
5 within the following area: Beginning at the east curb line of Morgan Ford at the
6 intersection of Morgan Ford and Juniata Street, thence north along Morgan Ford
7 to its intersection with Hartford Street; thence south to the point of beginning

8 **SECTION TWO.** This being an ordinance for the preservation of public peace,
9 health and safety, it is hereby declared to be an emergency measure within the meaning
10 of Sections 19 and 20 of Article IV of the Charter of the City of St. Louis and therefore
11 this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the
12 Mayor.
