George O. Hudson

WHEREAS, Mr. Hudson retired after serving 20 years in the United States Air Force as a Tech Sergeant; and

WHEREAS, he received his Masters Degree from St. Louis University; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hudson held a position at the Missouri State Employment Office; and

WHEREAS, he managed a department of 30 women at Angelica Uniform for 10 years; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hudson was an Ombudsmen/Urban Planner and wrote grants proposals to help build a police station at North Wood City Hall and fund many other important projects; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hudson served as a criminal investigator for the EEOC for 10 years; and

WHEREAS, he served as an Air Marshal for 11 years before retiring from the Federal Aviation Administration; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hudson came out of retirement and went back to work substitute teaching at many St. Louis Public Schools for 1st through 6th grade; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hudson went back to school and received his Early Childhood Development Certification - Director of Mime's Daycare.
