**Officer Julius K. Moore Memorial Highway**

**WHEREAS**, we pause in our deliberations to note the dedication of a memorial highway sign for the late Officer Julius K. Moore; and

**WHEREAS**, Julius Keith Moore was born in St. Louis, on November 8, 1985, to Pecola and Robert Earl Moore. Julius was the second child and the only boy born to his parents. Julius received his education from Normandy High in 2004, where he played on the basketball team. He continued his education at Hickey College, receiving a certificate for Paralegal and graduated in 2005. Julius entered the St. Louis Police Academy and graduated in December 2007 and started his law enforcement career in the South Patrol Area, Third District under the command of Captain Jerry Leyshock. Julius was preceded in death by his grandmothers, Josephine Jones and Prince Alice Moore and his grandfathers, Johnnie Williams and Otis Moore; and

**WHEREAS**, Julius confessed the hope in Christ and was baptized at four years old at Greater Fairfax Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Haymond Fortenberry; and

**WHEREAS**, Julius came from a "Strong Bonded" family who believed that a "Family that Prays Together, Stays Together." There was nothing Julius would not do for his family or a friend. Julius had a smile that would light up a room and that smile was his family trademark; and

**WHEREAS**, Julius loved his wife, his three children, his parents, all of his family members and his only sister, who was his best friend, Jennifer. Julius and Jennifer were thick as thieves and often called twins. They shared everything together. Julius lived life with a strong passion! He loved to sing, play his guitar and being a police officer. Julius took the oath of the St. Louis Police Department seriously to heart and honored it well; and

**WHEREAS**, at 6:10 on Thursday, October 15, 2009, Julius went home to be with the Lord.
