WHEREAS, Lois Daniel Ingram is President /CEO of L. D. Ingram Studio/Gallery, she has worked in media arts and conducted community arts programs since 1983; and

WHEREAS, Lois Daniel Ingram is a graduate of the St. Louis Regional Arts Commission’s CAT (Community Arts Training) Institute’s TIGER program; and

WHEREAS, she has committed her talent, heart, creative soul to change lives through the power of photography and multi-media art; and

WHEREAS, she is a 2012 Visionary Artist award recipient, she offers her studio/gallery to community neighbors interested in art and photography as an informal training center for at-risk youth; and

WHEREAS, Lois Ingram began her documentation of “The Doll Project” in 2008 with her students to create understanding and learning about the need of public displays for healing as a reaction to violent deaths; and

WHEREAS, “The Doll Project” is a traveling multi-media exhibit which pays artistic tribute to the memory of people who have died by violence; and

WHEREAS, “The Doll Project” seeks to develop understanding for open dialogue that gives value to all live, regardless of status; and

WHEREAS, “The Doll Project” will be on exhibit at the Missouri History Museum January 19, 2013 thru June 23, 2013.
