**Captain Ronald Johnson**

**WHEREAS**, Captain Ron Johnson of the Missouri State Highway Patrol is lifelong resident of the St. Louis area; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Johnson is a 27-year veteran of the Highway Patrol and oversees Troop C, which serves 11 counties around St. Louis, says Capt. Tim Hull of the Missouri State Highway Patrol. Troop C includes 147 uniformed officers and 157 civilian employees; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Johnson joined the Highway Patrol in 1987 after earning a degree in criminal justice at Florissant Valley Community College. He was promoted to corporal in 1995, sergeant in 1997 and became a captain in 2002; and

**WHEREAS**, He was appointed to the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission by Missouri governor Matt Blunt in 2007; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Johnson is married with two children; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 16-19, 2015, the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. Middle Western Province (MWP) and North Central Province (NCP) will host its annual three-day business meeting in the city of St. Louis, Missouri. This year, the MWP Council and NCP Council will be held jointly at the St. Louis Union Station Hotel. He is a fine example of the conference theme "Unswerving Brotherhood" by having a significant role in the high profile civil rights case of 2014 in Missouri.
