WHEREAS, the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood have devoted their lives to the belief that Catholic education is vital to the furthering of the Kingdom of God, the advancement of society, the diminishing of prejudice and the increasing of social justice and peace; and

WHEREAS, St. Elizabeth Academy is an important educational anchor in this City and will continue to serve this community for many years to come;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis that we pause in our deliberations to recognize and congratulate the administration, faculty, staff, and students of St. Elizabeth Academy on the occasion of the 125th Anniversary of the school's founding and we thank them for their many contributions to the St. Louis community and we further direct the Clerk of this Board to spread a copy of this Resolution across the minutes of these proceedings and to prepare a commemorative copy to the end that it may be presented to our honorees at a time and place deemed appropriate by the Sponsor.
